

I have been wondering jest how I might be able to secure some kind of convenience to do the necessary getting around while at my work at Fairplay. with only one automobile among the patrono, and the owner of that one living a little more than three miles up in walfow County it makes it a bit inconvenient where one must look after affairs. Whenever a condition arises not foreseen some days previous it often necessitated my walking the three miles to get someone to take me to at town. and if I found it impossible to get someone, this meant three more miles back to my boarding place. I course this is a little inconvenient at times. I have also wondered on what terms, if any, would the Find consider helping me provide some convenience in this particular situation. If you will consider this matter and refer it to those concerned, or whom it may concern, would appreciate your kindness so very very much. I shall be glad to hear from you concerning the opening of school this year. Thanking you kindly for your consideration I am AUG 24 1936 Allie B. Chenry.

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Dear Miss Cheney: I'm sorry school opens so late and also sorry that I have not answered your letter before. We've been in Georgia and have just returned.

I think the only thing we can do is conform with the county regulations. However, as far as you are concerned we propose to see to it that you receive the same salary that you did last year. In other words, we guarantee you the sum of \$70 a month for an eight-month period. We will handle it just as we did last year. During the months which the county pays you, that amount will be deducted from our check. During the months which the county does not pay you, we will pay you the full \$70.

I think it would be a good idea if you would get down to Fairplay two weeks or so before school opens. I should think it might be possible for you to do a good deal of community work during that time.

Mr. Simon has made arrangements about a car for you and is writing you about it. Our best greetings to you and we'll be down to Fairplay very shortly after you return.

My dear Miss Elvidge: I understand that the fund quaranteed a monthly salary of \$70.00 for eight months in the fairplay Project. I have recieved the total County salary covering the eight month that I taught at Fairplay, 1936-1939. Yesterday I received your Check dated may 28. This check as I understand was written from a salary of \$60. 45. Less the Country salary, which allowed me from the Fund \$35.145 instead of the regular monthly salary of \$45.00. I have made the entire eight months, considering four weeks as a school month as has been done heretofore. I know of no other possible reduction. Therefore I am somewhat puzzled about my eighth month salary being reduced to #60, 45. Please give consideration to matter. I shall expect to hear from you Concerning it.
