FELLOWSHIPS AND GRANTS-IN-AID
1928-1945

We are presenting in this special exhibit a summary of the program of fellowships undertaken by the Fund from 1928 to 1945. Such a summary was made in 1936 at the time the new program of fellowships was planned and again in 1941 after five years of the reorganized program. The present report includes not only the awards of the Division of Fellowships but also the grants given to individuals for study by the Divisions of Rural Education and Negro Health and other special projects, summarizing the total work of the Fund in the field of the development of personnel.

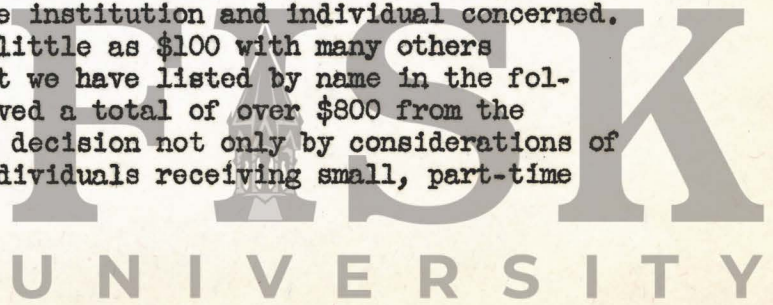
Fellowships - 1928-1936

In the first years of the reorganized Fund (1928), the major emphasis of the fellowship program was on the preparation of adequately-trained personnel for southern Negro schools and colleges, and for work in the field of public health and medicine. The Fund had worked out an informal division of labor with the General Education Board whereby teachers in the regular subjects of the arts and sciences were considered by that Board, while the Julius Rosenwald Fund concentrated its fellowships on teachers in the trades (including farming), in medicine and in nursing, in library administration, and in music and the specialties. Consideration was also given, however, to persons of unusual talent in any field though these were much in the minority.

During this early period the institution and its needs were the primary consideration; the development of personnel in various vocational fields was given more attention than individual talent. The Fund was engaged in promoting better educational opportunities for Negroes in the South on all levels from elementary to college and university. One of the means by which Negro education could be improved by the expenditure of relatively small sums was by giving advanced training to teachers and administrators. Providing training in the trades and in agriculture seemed to be one of the most direct ways of helping to raise the standard of living of Negroes.

Such grants as were given to talented Negroes in the arts and sciences, by offering them opportunities for study, travel, and creative work, enabled them to compete on an equal basis with others in their professions and in many cases to achieve national or international fame.

This rather informal program of grants was maintained from 1928 through 1936, for most of the time under the immediate direction of Mr. George Arthur, awards being made by the officers. There was no restriction on the amounts awarded or the length of time required for study, grants being determined by the specific needs of the institution and individual concerned. Some grants were made amounting to as little as \$100 with many others totalling \$400 or \$500. In this report we have listed by name in the following pages only those who have received a total of over \$800 from the Fund. We have been influenced in this decision not only by considerations of space but because we have felt that individuals receiving small, part-time



grants did not properly come under the designation Fellow. Unless a grant was sufficiently large to constitute an important aid in the recipient's training, therefore, the individual is not listed.

Fellowships - 1936-45

In 1936 when the financial condition of the Fund made it again possible to resume fellowship awards on a major scale, a new program was instituted. Grants for the development of specific personnel for definite posts were separated from the general fellowship program and were made an integral part of the programs of the Fund for which the personnel was being trained, namely, Rural Education and Negro Health. Payment for such grants was made from funds allocated to these Divisions.

The Division of Fellowships was set up to administer a general program open 1) to Negroes of unusual talents and abilities in any field of work, and 2) to white Southerners who wished to work on some problem distinctive to the South and who expected to make their careers in the South.

These fellowships were intended to provide opportunities for special experience or advanced study to individuals who had already given evidence of exceptional ability and who wished to prepare themselves further. They were open not only to scholars and scientists but to persons in the fine arts, creative writing, journalism, education, agriculture, business, and public service. Candidates between the ages of 24 and 35 were given preference, and they were expected to have completed their general college course or their general professional course before making application. Awards were expected to average about \$1500 and were normally for a full year's work. The program of fellowships was administered by a full-time director, and a committee was appointed to make the final selection of candidates, aided by selected juries which gave professional judgment in special fields.

The fellowship program established in 1936 has continued with only minor changes to the present. An additional category of candidates was added in 1944 for persons from any part of the United States who planned to make a career in the field of race relations.

Scholarship-aid program - 1941-44

Since 1941 there have been two additional types of awards administered by the Division of Fellowships. From 1941 to 1944 a group of scholarship-aid grants were made to graduating seniors from selected colleges. In 1941, the first year of the program, the grants were made only to Negroes. For the next three years scholarships were given to both Negro and white southern students. The Committee on Fellowships felt that many of the most promising senior students were, because of their very excellence, being drawn immediately into jobs and thus prevented from continuing their academic careers. Most of them did not have the financial resources to go on into graduate work immediately without aid. These graduating seniors were recommended by administrative and

teaching members of their faculties, the three most outstanding from the selected schools being allowed to apply. After 1941 the scholarships gave the student a set stipend of tuition plus \$500 toward living expenses. (In 1941 the cash awards were somewhat less.)

In the four years of the scholarship-aid program awards were made to fifty Negroes and to sixteen white students. The scholarship-aid program was dropped in 1945 since there was some dissatisfaction with the method of selection. It was also felt that because of the almost total absence of young men in the graduating classes, this was an unbalanced period in which to develop a new type of program. However, many of the young people have made remarkable records, and several have gone on to obtain the Ph.D. and to outstanding accomplishment.

Labor Scholarships - 1945

This fall a new program of labor scholarships has been set up with the cooperation of the CIO and the AF of L. The scholarships are intended to give additional training to young trade unionists in the South, both Negro and white, with a view to developing a competent and liberal leadership in that field. The labor scholarships have no educational requirements beyond the demonstrated ability to do work on the college level.

No awards have yet been made, but it is expected that several will be made this fall for work in the coming semester. Antioch College has been selected as the institution which most of the candidates will attend because of its liberal traditions, interest in the labor movement, and cooperative plan of work and study. Candidates will be selected by a committee composed of representatives of the CIO, AF of L, and the Fund.

DEVELOPMENT OF PERSONNEL

Negro Health Grants - 1934-44

Although a large part of the total grants in medicine and in public health were made under the early fellowship program, from 1934 to 1942 awards in these fields were made by the Division of Negro Health under its Development of Personnel budget. The majority of awards were to persons who were given training for work in the institutions in which the Division was interested or for special projects in Negro medicine and public health. The Division of Negro Health made grants to twenty-four individuals of \$800 or more and spent \$62,307 in total awards for training and development of personnel.

Rural Education - 1937-1945

Under the program of development of personnel in Rural Education there have been awards of over \$800 to twenty-three white teachers and administrators and to twenty-four Negroes. The awards of the Division of Rural Education for study to date total \$87,239. These fellowships have for the most part been restricted to the faculties of Tuskegee Institute, Fort Valley State College, Jackson College, and West Georgia College in which the Division is carrying out intensive programs.

SPECIAL PROJECTS*

Fellowships in the Mental and Social Sciences - 1930-35

During the period before the depression when the Fund was engaged in numerous projects in general education and in social fields, appropriations were made for fellowships in the mental and social sciences. A total of \$66,383 was paid from these appropriations during the years 1930 to 1935.

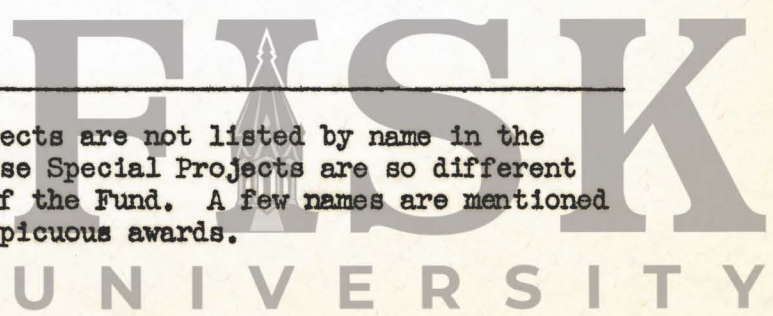
A total of thirty-six individuals were aided (five of them for more than one year) in securing advanced training or in demonstrating new types of work. One third of the grants were made to personnel at institutions with which the Fund was working at that time (Emory, Swarthmore, the University of Hawaii, the University of Chicago, the University of Pennsylvania). In this category was D. L. Crawford, President of the University of Hawaii, who received a grant of \$1800 for studies in the Pacific. The next largest group of awards was for work in the mental sciences; Dr. Franz Alexander was given \$4500 in 1930-31 to enable him to serve as visiting professor in psychoanalysis at the University of Chicago, and \$5000 the following year to enable him to work with the Judge Baker Foundation in Boston. W. E. Blatz, now head of the child study department of the University of Toronto received \$2500 for study abroad in the field of child development. C. M. Hincks, Director of the Canadian National Committee for Mental Hygiene, made a study of the relationship between mental hygiene and general education through the aid of a \$2000 grant. Other groups of awards were for studies of southern problems and for studies in educational methods. Among these Fellows were Donald Pierson who received a grant of \$1000 toward his study of the Negro in Brazil, and Carleton Washburne, until the war, head of the Winnetka Public Schools, for a study of educational methods in Europe and in Asia.

Southern Fellowships in Social Science

In 1929 a program of fellowships was initiated through the Social Science Research Council, open to southern social scientists both Negro and white. The purpose of the grants was "to interest young people in the field to assemble material bearing on southern social problems." A committee headed by Dr. W. W. Alexander made the selection of candidates. There were two classes of fellowships: 1) junior fellowships for students just graduating from college, for their first year of graduate work, carrying a stipend of not more than \$600; 2) senior fellowships for persons more advanced in graduate study, carrying a stipend of \$750. Both types of grants were occasionally supplemented by an allowance for travel.

The first awards were made in 1930-31 to twenty-six persons, with twenty Fellows appointed in 1931-32, the total awards for the two years being \$36,530. Of the forty-six grants provided, thirty-four were to whites, twelve to Negroes.

*Fellows in these various Special Projects are not listed by name in the tabulations of this exhibit, since these Special Projects are so different from the general continuing programs of the Fund. A few names are mentioned in the text simply as examples of conspicuous awards.



Grants-in-aid of Southern Research

Beginning in 1931 appropriations totaling \$28,500 were made to the Social Science Research Council for grants-in-aid of research to southern scholars. It was recognized that save for three or four universities there was an almost total lack of funds for research in southern institutions, and it was hoped that these grants would enable mature southern teachers to carry through research projects. From these funds sixty-two grants have been made, chiefly of very small amounts, and largely to white scholars. Of the total appropriations the Social Science Research Council has an unexpended balance of \$5,539 available for grants in future years.

Emory Library Scholarships

A total of \$9000 was appropriated between 1931-33 to Emory University for scholarships in the Library School with a special view toward attracting well-qualified men into library service in the South. Thirteen fellowships were awarded. In 1942 funds for scholarships were made available to the Emory Library School to train county librarians for Georgia's state library program, three awards of \$500 each being made.

Grants-in-aid to Negro Social Workers

In 1942 an appropriation of \$6000 was made to be used over a two-year period for grants-in-aid to Negro social workers at the New York School of Social Work and other northern institutions. There were nine grants made from this appropriation, all but two for \$300, the others for less, making a total of \$2,455. The unused balance of the grant was paid to the Atlanta School of Social Work for support of their training of social workers.



COMMENTS ON THE FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM

A qualitative analysis of the fellowship program offers more difficulties than a quantitative report. It is almost impossible to assess the social value of a person, and still more difficult to assess the role a fellowship may have played in his development. There is a strong tendency naturally to stress those individuals who have won prominence in their fields and to by-pass those with less glamour, known only in their own small circles, though the county librarian or the rural school supervisor, in his niche, may contribute as much as the writer or singer with a national audience.

Certainly the fellowship program has contributed much toward better-trained teachers in the Negro colleges. There are nearly two hundred of our Fellows* in teaching and administrative positions in institutions throughout the South. Fellowship-trained Negro specialists still dominate the staffs of the Negro training hospitals, with others in private practice in every field of medical specialization. Other Fellows have taken their place in state, municipal, and county government, in departments of education, as county agents and home demonstrators, and as public health officials. Five of our Negro Fellows are college presidents.

A number of our Negro Fellows have served in the federal government both as consultants and as executives in various bureaus and departments. The most notable of these is Ralph J. Bunche, who received a fellowship to study in Africa and Europe, recently appointed Acting Chief of the Division of Dependent Area Affairs of the Department of State and a member of the Anglo-Caribbean Commission. He was a technical adviser on the section of the U.N.C.I.O. charter on international trusteeship, and is a member of the United States delegation to the London United Nations Conference on International Organization.

In the field of race relations Fellows hold prominent positions in such organizations as the National Association for the Development of Colored People, the Urban League, the American Council on Race Relations, and the Mayor's Committee on Race Relations of Chicago. Three of our Fellows head community houses, the most outstanding being Flanner House in Indianapolis directed by Cleo W. Blackburn. Mr. Blackburn has been cited as one of the most distinguished and useful citizens of Indianapolis, and his development of Flanner House has won attention throughout the country.

Among the scientists on our fellowship roster are five who hold responsible research positions in private industry with such companies as Stromberg-Carlson, Kodak Research Laboratories, Atlantic Research Associates.

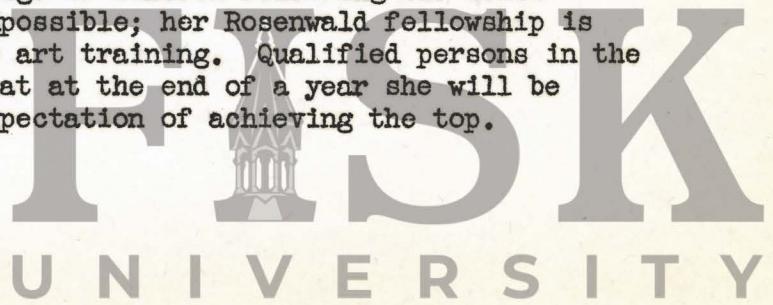

Percy L. Julian, chief chemist of the Glidden Company of Chicago, holds the major research position in his firm and is one of the outstanding industrial chemists of the country. James E. LuValle, who received three Rosenwald grants (1938-40) and is now a chemist in the experimental laboratories of the Eastman Kodak Company, was, it may be interesting to note, not only a brilliant student but a famous athlete and a member of the U.S. Olympic team in 1936. He is given a chapter in Arna Bontemps' book of sketches on young Negroes who have succeeded in new fields of endeavor, We Have Tomorrow.

Incidentally, out of the twelve whose careers are sketched in Bontemps' book - twelve people working in fields which had for the most part seemed closed to Negroes until they opened the doors - five are Rosenwald Fellows: Mildred Blount, who designed hats for John-Frederic's and for the movies, and is now an independent designer; Horace R. Cayton, Director of Parkway Community House, Chicago, and author of Black Metropolis, a sociological analysis of the Chicago Negro community; Beatrice Johnson Trammel, a public health nurse who received a fellowship to study at the Labenstine Clinic Branch of the Maternity Center in New York City, and who is a teacher of nurse-midwifery at Tuskegee; Dean Dixon, conductor and organizer of the American Youth Orchestra, a current Fellow; and James LuValle. Similarly six of the figures in 13 Against the Odds are Rosenwald Fellows.

In the arts Marian Anderson, whose first European tour was made possible by the Fund, remains the foremost American singer on the concert stage. William Grant Still, who held fellowships in 1939 and 1940, is one of the most famed and most played of modern composers. His "Afro-American Symphony" was played at the first symphony concert given in Berlin after its occupation by Allied Forces. His opera, "Troubled Island," with book by Langston Hughes (also a Fellow), is scheduled for production next spring at the City Center of New York under the direction of Leopold Stokowsky. Selma Burke, who held a fellowship in sculpture in 1940, has just completed a portrait in bronze of President Roosevelt. The commission was placed as a result of a competition in 1943. Katherine Dunham, whose studies in the West Indies on a Rosenwald fellowship have resulted in several revues of West Indian dances and helped to launch an outstanding career as an actress and dancer, has recently established through the American Council on African Education a scholarship to pay for four years of training for an African student in an American University. Gordon Parks, the only photographer ever to hold a fellowship, has become one of the best-known industrial photographers in the United States. U.S. Camera for 1944 (a collection of outstanding photographs of the year) carried more of Parks's photographs than of any other individual; he is an industrial and research photographer for the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey.

This year among our Fellows is a twenty-three-year-old girl in the field of commercial art. Small scholarships had permitted her to take occasional evening courses at Pratt Institute, but having to care for three brothers and a sister since the age of sixteen following the death of her parents made full-time study impossible; her Rosenwald fellowship is enabling her to spend full time on her art training. Qualified persons in the commercial art field have predicted that at the end of a year she will be ready to enter the field with every expectation of achieving the top.



A number of our Negro Fellows have received positions on the faculties of northern universities, helping to establish a trend, which the Fund is also sponsoring in other ways, toward the appointment of able scholars and teachers regardless of race. Those who have full-time positions in such institutions are: Thomas H. Bembry, instructor of chemistry, College of the City of New York; Marion Cuthbert, instructor in sociology, Brooklyn College; Wade Ellis, special instructor in mathematics, University of Michigan; Cornelius Golightly and Catherine Cater Golightly, both on the staff of Olivet College, Olivet, Michigan; Kenneth B. Clark, instructor in psychology, College of the City of New York; Adelaide Cromwell Hill, instructor in sociology, Smith College; Estelle Massey Riddle, instructor in nursing, New York University; Allison Davis, assistant professor of education at the University of Chicago; Charles Wesley Buggs, assistant professor of bacteriology at Wayne University.

Sterling Brown and E. Franklin Frazier, both of Howard University, hold temporary appointments at Vassar and Sarah Lawrence Colleges, respectively. Lawrence Reddick, a Fellow in history and curator of the Schomburg Collection, is a part-time member of the faculty of the College of the City of New York. J. Ernest Wilkins, who obtained his Ph.D. in mathematics at the University of Chicago at the age of 19, has participated in research on the atomic bomb as an associate physicist at the Metallurgical Laboratory of the University of Chicago for the past two years. Another of our Fellows in mathematics, Jeremiah Certaine, has been a member of the staff of the Radiation Laboratory at Harvard University.

Of the white Fellows, almost one third are teaching in white southern colleges and universities. Of these the majority used their fellowships for study in northern institutions or abroad, receiving wider experience outside their own region. Among the most distinguished is Ina Corinne Brown, Professor of Social Anthropology serving Scarritt, Vanderbilt, and Fisk Universities, who studied in London and at the University of Chicago.

One of the most significant groups among our white Fellows has been the creative writers. Tarleton Collier, Associate Editor of the Courier-Journal, Louisville, is a force in the South both as writer and newspaperman. Lillian Smith's Strange Fruit, published last year and now being brought to the stage, was a best seller which brought the problems of Negro-white relationships in the South to the attention of every segment of the American reading public. Thomas Sancton, a native of Louisiana and a former managing editor of The New Republic and later an editor of Life, has used his fellowship to return to the South where he is working on two books on the South, one a novel and the other a social study of the region. Harnett Kane (who received his grant in history) has developed into one of the most prolific and popular of American writers. His books and articles show a consistently liberal point of view, and a realistic approach to current southern problems.



James Maddox is perhaps the most outstanding of our Fellows in the federal government. He is an agricultural economist in the United States Department of Agriculture where he has an important voice in determining agricultural policies, particularly in the South. Mr. Maddox is secretary of the American delegation to the International Conference on World Agriculture and Food Problems now meeting in Quebec. His studies on a Rosenwald fellowship abroad have contributed greatly to his status as a world authority on food problems. H. W. Culbreth, a Fellow in economics in 1938, Organization Director of the Ohio Farm Bureau Federation and an authority on the cooperative movement, has recently returned from the London meeting of the International Cooperative Alliance.

Among the white Fellows in the fine arts, two have played an important part in recording World War II pictorially. Tom Lea has covered much of the Pacific War as artist-correspondent for Life. Many of his pictures have been reproduced in that magazine. A book of his sketches, Peleliu Landing, has recently been published. Charles Shannon has been an artist for the Army, painting camp life as well as combat scenes. Other of our Fellows in the fine arts are contributing importantly to the contemporary art of the country.

In history, C. Vann Woodward has established himself as one of the soundest historians in the United States, with his major interest in southern history. He is at present in the Navy, on leave from Scripps College.

In the field of journalism, several of our Fellows hold significant posts. James Pope, Managing Editor of the Louisville Courier-Journal, one of the most important liberal newspapers in the South, has been Assistant Director of Censorship during the war. Ralph McGill is Editor of the Atlanta Constitution. During the war he has spent much time in Europe, and his informed viewpoint on world affairs is an asset to the South. Gould Beech, Associate Editor of the Montgomery Advertiser, during the war has been Chief of the Orientation Branch of the Information and Education Section, U.S. Army, under General Osborne, and as such has had direction over the social and political training given to all men in the Army.

Among the sociologists are many who have made important contributions to the literature and teaching of southern social problems. Among those outside the teaching field who are making notable contributions are Louise Young, Executive Secretary of the United Churchwomen of America, and Doris Porter, who is the nutritionist on the American staff of UNRRA. Her studies in Europe, on a Rosenwald grant, of the dietary habits of European countries led directly to her present position in which she has the responsibility for determining the type of food to export to various countries under UNRRA.

The areas in which the fellowship program has yielded least have been in the fields of labor and religion. The officers are now actively engaged in a program of special labor scholarships, and are conferring with various southern groups as to ways to increase our influence in southern leadership.
