Dear Supt. Tidwell:

After the announcement of the budget on May 3, 1928, which includes an additional allowance of \$50. per classroom for permanent construction of rural schoolhouses, it was brought to the attention of the officers of the Fund that this same consideration should be given on shops and teachers' homes since they are an important part of the school plant. The Fund has, therefore, approved the following additional allowance for the year 1928-29:

Dear Mr. Smith:

Herewith enclosed please find our suggestive budget for Julius Rosenwald Fund aid in Alabama for the year 1929-1930.

We have made conservative estimates on each of the separate programs, item by item. Of course, these are only estimates and will be subject to variation.

On the question of consolidation and transportation, we feel that it is not wise to press the matter too much. There is no doubt that it is going to be the program of the future, but we must attack the problem in such a way that there will be no unfavorable reaction. At the present time, and probably for a year or two - maybe longer - superintendents will prefer to contract with owners of motor busses rather than to provide busses for negroes at the expense of the county school funds. I think this attitude is wise as "human nature does not change over night".

We desire to make application for aid on the following projects for the year 1929-30:

1 TERM EXTENSION-

One-half salaries of 30 teachers in 10 schools \$ 750, with the understanding that the Fund will pay one dollar for one the first year, one for two the second year, and one for three the third year for an extension of one month or two months, on condition that no salary on which aid is given is to be less than \$50, and further that the county will agree to continue such extension without aid after the third year. (Do not include in this request any part of salaries of teachers on which aid is given the present year.)

2 TRANSPORTATION OF PUPILS-

(a) One-half the cost of operating 5 auto transportation busses an average of 8 months at \$ 80 per month \$ 3,840 1920 with the understanding that the Fund will give one dollar for one the first year, one for two the second year, and one for three the third year, and that the county will pay the remainder each year and will agree to continue these busses without aid after the third year

OR, where the county desires to purchase busses,

\* (b) One-half the cost of purchasing        new transportation busses at an average cost of \$        each, ----- \$       .

(Do you feel that a county would agree to pay all the cost of transportation if the Fund should give half the cost of a bus, or would it be necessary to offer to pay a part of the operating expenses also?)

\* Until the work is better established, it would perhaps be unwise to raise the question of purchasing busses. Superintendents prefer at the present time to contract with owners for transportation.

# Two other transportation busses are now under consideration, but the matter has not been definitely decided.

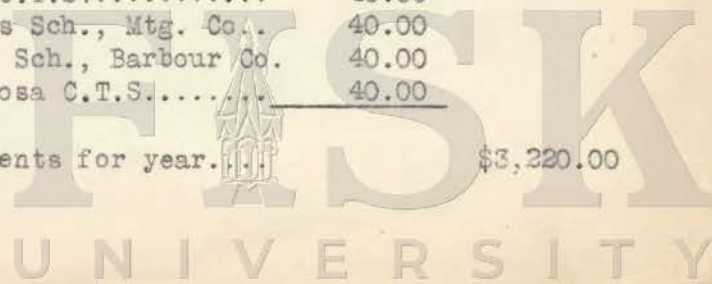

Dear Supt. Tidwell:

The Trustees of the Julius Rosenwald Fund have appropriated for 1928-29 \$11,200 for aid on 280 libraries in Rosenwald schools of the South. Only 222 of these are allocated to the states, leaving 58 to be drawn on by those using up their quotas.

Aid will be given on one size only costing \$120 - \$40 to be raised by the school community, \$40 from public funds, and \$40 by the Fund. The general plan of operation will be the same as that of the present year, full particulars of which will be announced soon. We thought by giving you this information early several schools might raise their quotas this Spring, so that the books could be ordered in July or August and be available for use the entire school year.

In addition to the appropriation for libraries \$150 was included to pay part of the expenses of your state librarian or a member of the library commission to visit under the direction of your department each of the schools where these libraries are placed, giving instructions on the care and use of books. They could also inspect the libraries which have been placed this year to see how they are being used and cared for the second year.

A serious effort is now being made in Alabama to standardize and  
accredit high schools for negroes in county training and other public  
schools - rural and urban. Probably a dozen will be put on the list this  
year. The plan calls for a minimum \$450 library. Aid from Julius Rosen-  
wald Fund for the purchase of library books suitable to high school grades  
is desired for about six or eight schools on the next year's budget.
