1939 Renewed for study of economic history and human geography abroad, for one year, at University of Paris and possibly in Sweden. Postponed this year of study in order to return to Atlanta University to teach for one year. Expects to begin work abroad in 1940.

Mr. Dean surrendered his 1939 grant in view of the probability that he would be unable to study abroad for some time. THIS GRANT RETURNED TO FUND BECAUSE OF INABILITY TO STUDY UNDER ITS TERMS

Renewal in 1938 was made to enable him to continue research and complete the manuscript.

Renewal in 1939 for study at Paris, with Bloch; in Sweden with Ohlin.

Served as Lecturer, summer of 1939 at the City College of New York, doing classroom instruction in Economic and Business Statistics.

Postponed 1939 fellowship to return to Atlanta University to teach one year.

Is now Professor of Economics at Atlanta, with a substantial increase in salary. 9/21/39

9/24/40 Appointment as professor was not made. Is now assistant professor of economics.

In October, 1938, Mr. Dean reported that one fifth of his dissertation, "The Theory of Geographic Location of Economic Activities," had been published under Harvard University auspices for undergraduate and graduate instruction in the location of economic activities. It is assigned in two economics courses there, and is being used at the University of Michigan and Iowa.

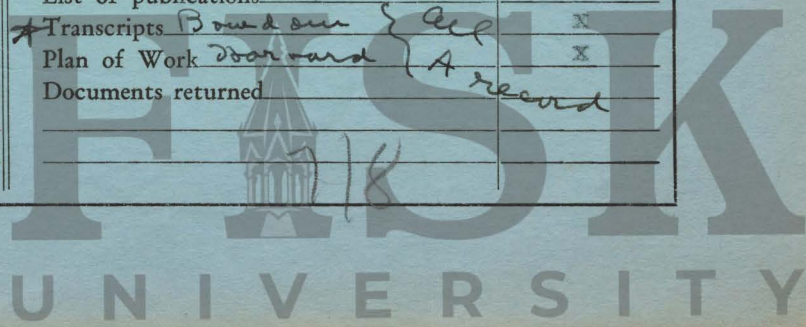

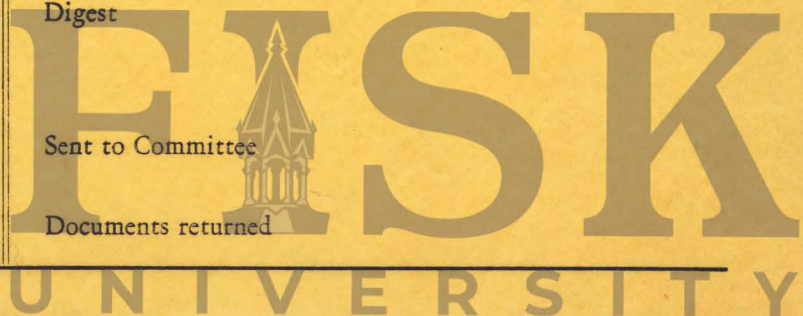
