Dear Mr. Clark: I am enclosing an announcement of the fellowships offered by the Julius Rosenwald Fund. You will note that these are offered under two categories: (1) to Negroes, without restriction as to field; (2) to white southerners who are expected to work on some problem peculiar to the South.

It has been our custom to send announcements to colleges and universities in the fall, but knowing that you have a large summer enrollment which will include a number of persons who do not attend the regular session, I am sending this announcement to you at this time in the hope that you will post it in a prominent place and that you will give it any other publicity that you can.

We are not interested in getting simply a large number of applications, as about 600 come without much effort on our part; we are particularly interested in having exceptional applicants in both of the fellowship groups. It will, therefore, be of great service to us if you and members of the summer school staff will call our fellowships to the attention of outstanding students who might be interested.

It may be possible for me to visit your institution during the summer, and if so I hope to have an opportunity to talk with you.
