Seemingly the present outlook is somewhat brighter for the future of Negro medicine in a good many ways. Better still so far as Atlanta is concerned.

Have been pretty busy all Summer holding various clinics for the city and county and the state. The latter mentioned is contributing a stipend to the amount the city pays for V.D. control work, and they have added two clinics per week.

We are planning a Fall campaign in the social disease work rather than to wait until a few days before the Negro National Health Week next year and start something for a week. I had the opportunity of presiding over a rather interesting group of doctors, social workers, ministers etc. today at the Urban League in this respect.

The Georgia Tuberculosis Association has just held its annual meeting in Savannah and Dr. Nash got off a nice talk before the joint session.

I have't been over to Grady in the past two weeks but I worked there nearly all Summer in the clinics. Will be glad to hear from you at your pleasure.
