GRADUATE SCHOOL

TWENTY UNIVERSITY FELLOWSHIPS

Awarded on basis of scholastic merit and research ability as shown by one year of graduate study. Occasionally, first year graduate students whose undergraduate records are outstanding are considered. Available to students in all departments offering graduate work. \$700

TWENTY-FIVE SCHOLARSHIPS

Any graduate student may apply.

SPECIAL FELLOWSHIPS

Several fellowships, especially industrial fellowships in Chemistry, are also available. Applications for fellowships and scholarships should be made to the Dean of the Graduate School. Applications for assistantships should be made to the Dean of the Graduate School or to the department in which the student desires to do graduate work. All applications should be completed by March 15, 1945. (Because of the war conditions, outstanding applicants may be given consideration even after March 15.)

SCHOOL OF BUSINESS

The School of Business has available a number of graduate assistantships. These are open to graduates of accredited colleges and universities and carry stipends of \$150 to \$500 per semester. The typical appointment is for \$300 per semester, under which appointment the candidate may earn nine to twelve hours of graduate credit per semester. Nonresident graduate students who are tutors, fellows, or assistants pay the same fees as resident students. Graduate courses and research programs lead to the degrees Master of Science in Business, Master of Commercial Science, and, through a joint program with the Department of Economics, Doctor of Philosophy is given by the Graduate School. Students who wish to become candidates for assistantships are invited to write for complete details.

SCHOOL OF EDUCATION

The School of Education has several graduate assistantships available to graduate students who are working toward the Doctor's degree. The amount of compensation depends upon the number of hours of service a student gives in the way of assisting the different instructors. The credit load that the student carries depends upon the compensation received and the number of hours of service each week. The compensation ranges from \$700 to \$800 for the academic year (two semesters) for fifteen hours of work and twelve hours of class work each week. The compensation is reduced proportionately for an assistantship in which the student works nine hours and carries fifteen hours of class work. (\$700 for two semesters is the maximum for the first time the assistantship is granted to the student.) Applications for the assistantships in the School of Education should be filed before March 15 of the year preceding the year for which the assistantship is desired, and should be filed each year with the Dean of the School of Education.

SCHOOL OF LAW

A limited number of scholarships in the School of Law are available. Application for these scholarships should be made directly to the Dean of the School of Law.

SCHOOL OF MUSIC

The School of Music makes available a few graduate assistantships with stipends of \$700 for two semesters. The graduate assistant is expected to perform various duties requiring not more than twelve hours per week. These may include the following—instruction in applied music, grading of papers in theory and history, accompanying, clerical assistance in research, etc. Application is invited from qualified graduates of music schools and departments who expect to pursue study towards the Master's degree. Address the Dean of the School of Music.

Indiana University is now operating on the basis of three semesters. The next semester will open on April 28, 1945. Appointments will be made for service or study to begin in April and also in September. Appointments to the fellowships listed above will be made for two semesters. If services are required for three semesters, compensation will be adjusted accordingly.
