Dear Supt. Hart:

We are happy to announce to you that The Julius Rosenwald Fund on March 23, 1925, appropriated \$475,630, including administrative expenses, to aid in the construction of rural schools and teachers' homes through the State Departments of Education in the fourteen Southern States for the year beginning July 1, 1925, and ending June 30, 1926.

As Mr. Rosenwald authorized me to make up the budget for schoolhouse construction in the various southern states, keeping the total within the limit of \$450,000, I carefully prepared the budget, being guided largely by (a) the requests from the states (b) the number of projects approved and completed on the present year's budget and (c) the number and size of projects I felt that each state could provide funds for and adequately supervise the construction of for the year beginning July 1, 1925, and ending June 30, 1926.

The allotment for Virginia is as follows:

Applications on the 1925-26 budget may be filed at any time from now until March 1, 1926, with the understanding that every building on which aid is expected will be completed and paid for by June 15, 1926, at which time any unused balance will revert.

Mr. Rosenwald and the Trustees of The Fund join us in expressing our appreciation to you and your department for the sympathetic and hearty cooperation you have given us in the past and in hoping for the same helpful cooperation under the 1925-26 budget.

The aid for schools and additions above a six-teacher type - seven-teacher to ten-teacher, inclusive - is for county training schools or county high schools striving to meet state requirements for high school standardization. Copies of the detailed plan for distribution of aid will be mailed within a few days.

Beginning July 1, 1927, the Fund agrees to give aid for shops on condition that (a) the building be erected according to plans and specifications furnished or approved by the Fund, (b) an ample supply of tools be purchased, and (c) a trained teacher be provided to take charge of the work.



The number of one-teacher schools is the maximum on which the Fund will give aid the next budget year, and the number of two-teacher schools cannot be exceeded without special authorization by the officers of the Fund. In keeping with modern trends of education the Fund desires to concentrate more and more in the larger consolidated schools.

In order to stimulate the construction of more permanent buildings the Fund has increased its allotment \$50.00 per classroom for brick veneer, solid brick, or satisfactory concrete construction, as shown above in the last column, the maximum for a ten-teacher or larger being \$2,600. We now have a complete set of plans worked out in detail for brick veneer construction from a three-teacher to a ten-teacher type, which will be furnished the State Department as needed.

For the present budget year the Fund is giving aid on two types of shops - a one-room (\$300) and a two-room (\$400). Because of urgent demands from some of the states it was thought best to increase this aid for 1928-29 to \$500. for a three-room shop to include facilities for home economics in the larger vocational schools. Plans for a three-room shop have been worked out in tentative form and will be adjusted to suit the needs of the schools to be served.

As the average term of the schools on which the Fund is giving aid the present year is more than six months, it has been decided to increase the minimum requirement for next year from five months to six months.

Please let me take this opportunity in behalf of the officers and Trustees of the Fund to thank you and your staff for your hearty cooperation and to assure you of our interest in every phase of progress in the education system of your State. When we can serve you, command us.

\$600 was the maximum allowance for a shop, but after the budget had been approved the Fund decided to increase aid to a four-room type, allowing \$600 for frame and \$1,000 for permanent construction. Wherever a shop is built of permanent construction the Fund will give \$50 per room more than in the regular frame construction, just the same as in the case of schools and classroom additions. When you file the inspection report, if the building meets the requirements of a four-room shop, you may include the maximum of \$800, requesting us to change the application to correspond.

I am glad to know that Mr. Dickinson is working on the libraries. We shall appreciate having them sent in just as fast as they are ready and assure you that the books will be shipped immediately on receipt of applications. Remember that those who take up their quotas first will be allowed to draw on the unallocated number of 58. I shall be happy to see your State share in this extra number.

Dear Mr. Gresham:

In order to stimulate the building of a school in every county which has no Rosenwald school, the following resolution was passed at a recent meeting of the Board of Trustees:

That the Julius Rosenwald Fund offer a sum one and one-half times as large as the present allotment to the first Negro school unit built in each of the counties in the fourteen Southern States where there is no Rosenwald School; the school unit to consist of a schoolhouse from a two-teacher to a ten-teacher type, and to include if desired a shop or teachers' home, this offer to extend until June 30, 1929.

I am sure you will want to make this bonus of 50 per cent on the first school built in a county as far reaching as possible, and that you and the superintendent will put forth much effort to see that an unusually good building is erected and well equipped, as a demonstration to other communities in the county which may qualify for the regular allotment.

In a new county where two or more small communities are desiring to build Rosenwald schools of the one-teacher type, it may be possible for you to use this bonus to encourage the building of a consolidated school; or possibly in some community where they are planning to erect a frame building you might use this to stimulate the erection of a permanent building, since the bonus would be larger for this type of construction.

There may be some new county which could be induced this year to build a model school unit - a schoolhouse, a teachers' home, and a shop - because of the extra 50 per cent on each of the three buildings.

The Fund has made a special appropriation to take care of this bonus so that it will not come out of your regular budget allotment.

Please let me have your reactions on this project and suggestions as to how many new counties you think can take advantage of this exceptional offer the present year.
