

SCHOLARSHIP-AID GRANTS

This year the Committee tried an experiment in the granting of junior scholarships to persons just being graduated from a few of the better colleges. These awards are for \$250 plus tuition at whatever institution the student chooses, and they are an attempt to "save" a few of the brightest of the seniors for scholarly and creative work. This is purely an experiment. We shall follow these young people with close interest and will discuss with the trustees whether or not it is worth while to continue the project.
