AWARDS

The number of fellowship applicants is several times the number of fellowships available for award. To the ranking candidates not receiving fellowships, a number of graduate service scholarships are awarded. A graduate service scholarship enables the holder to earn his tuition by some form of service to the University. This service—such as laboratory assistant, library attendant, or assistant to a member of the faculty—is assigned in the department in which the greater part of the scholar's work has been done. Recipients of service scholarships pay the amount of the tuition in cash at the beginning of each quarter, and at the close of the quarter receive a cash payment for the amount of service satisfactorily rendered. In case a fellowship is not available and a service scholarship is not acceptable, cross out the word "SCHOLARSHIP" at the top of this sheet.

CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTANCE

A fellow is expected to be in residence three full quarters of the year, to be present on the first day of each quarter of residence, and to report to the Chairman of the Department for his assignment of work.

If a fellow wishes to work for compensation in addition to the fellowship work required by the Department (except an N.Y.A. assignment), he should request permission of the Chairman of the Committee on Fellowships and Scholarships.

The holder of a fellowship is required to pay full tuition fees of \$100 a quarter at the opening of each quarter whether or not he registers for full work.

APPLICATION

Candidates for fellowships or scholarships will fill out and return this blank with official transcripts of undergraduate and graduate records, copies of any original work which they have done, and letters from persons familiar with their work and character, to the COMMITTEE ON FELLOWSHIPS AND SCHOLARSHIPS, THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO, CHICAGO, ILLINOIS, on or before March 1. Assignments will be made on or about April 1.

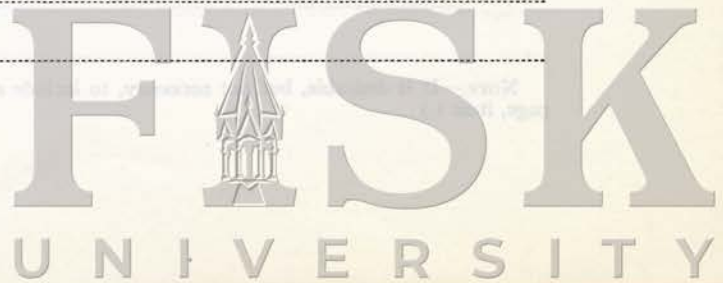
