Ten Graduate Fellowships in Government Management

PURPOSE

The Department of Government Management offers a twelve-month graduate program designed to train students for positions of responsibility in organizations engaged in the evaluation of government administrative policies and operation.

FELLOWSHIPS

Ten graduate fellowships providing \$100 per month for twelve months are awarded to students of superior ability and adequate background. Some fellowships may be awarded to applicants from particular areas depending upon the sponsorship. Undergraduate preparation in the fields of political science, economics, public administration, accounting and statistics is desirable. Candidates are rated on their academic record and their personal qualities of character, leadership and social responsibility. A candidate must make formal application before May 15, 1948. The program begins September 20, 1948. The regular University tuition of \$480 for the four quarters will be charged.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

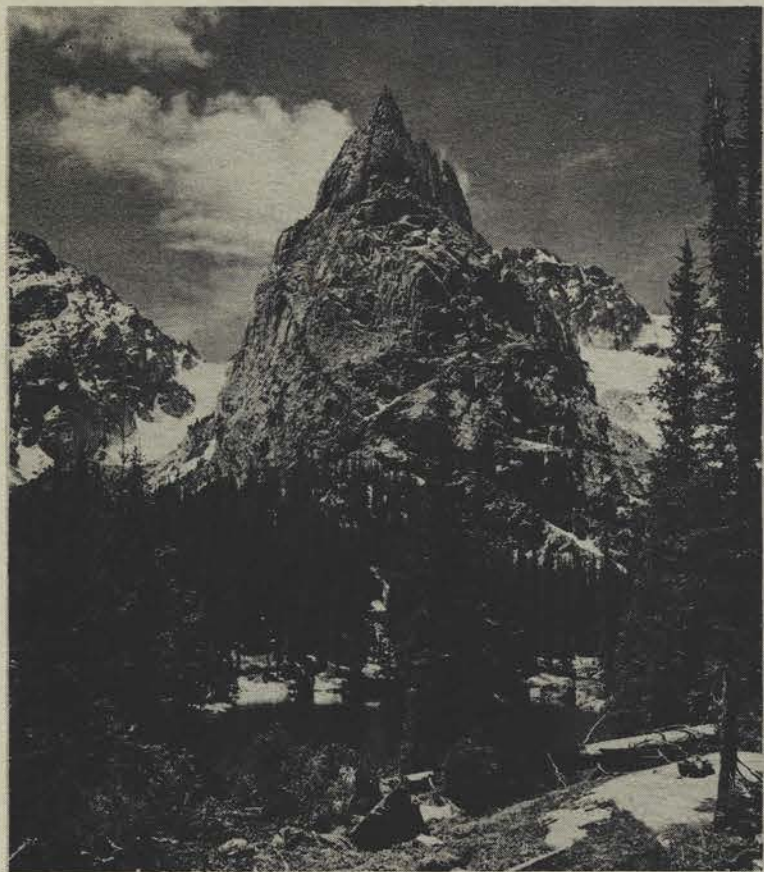
The fellowship program leads to the degree of Master of Science in Government Management. The curriculum includes the following subjects:

Administrative Law	Public Reporting
Citizens' Groups	Public Opinion
Governmental Accounting	Public Works
Governmental Planning	Public Welfare
Personnel Administration	Research Methods
Public Education	State & Local Govt.
Public Finance	Statistics

Specialists with a national reputation in public administration and citizens' organizations supplement the University staff. Students are assigned major research projects dealing with an aspect of administration. Conferences are held with public officials on governmental practices and problems.

FIELD WORK

For three months during the summer, students are assigned specific field projects requiring the appraisal of a unit of government. Results of the survey are formulated in a report which constitutes the thesis requirement. While on assignment, students are visited periodically by faculty members who guide and direct their project. During the ten years that the program has been in operation, assignments have been completed in twenty-two states. At the end of this field assignment, the students return to Denver where they attend a number of seminars dealing with the problems confronted during the field studies. Expenses for travel to and from the place of field work are paid by the Department of Government Management.

PLACEMENT

The Department of Government Management has been successful in placing its graduates in responsible positions throughout the United States. Graduates are now employed as heads of taxpayer organizations, municipal bureaus of research, as specialists with evaluating agencies, as technicians in all levels of government, and as university administrators and faculty members. In recent years each graduate of the Department has had the opportunity of selecting from several offers, the position in which his particular abilities might be utilized to the greatest advantage. A favorable situation exists in that the demand for individuals having practical training in government appears to be increasing. It is only reasonable, therefore, that beginning salaries of Government Management Fellows have been uniformly attractive. In addition, frequent promotion has been the experience of the Fellows.
