Dear Mr. Haygood:

Of course I will be delighted to look over the compositions of the various candidates, and will give you my opinion as soon as possible after seeing the scores. As you know, I am always grateful for the help I have received from the Rosenwald Fund, and this is a very small way in which to return some of the satisfaction I received.

Your letter mentioned that there may be only one year of the fellowship program after this current one. In that case, I am wondering whether you would put this letter of mine as a postscript to the report I wrote to you some weeks ago regarding candidate Ulysses Kay, and also as a postscript to the conversation I had with Dr. Embree on his recent visit here. In both of these I recommended that Ulysses be given a Fellowship, but that it be delayed for a while. Since you say that the entire fellowship program will not last much longer, don't you think he ought to have his Fellowship now? My aim was not to deprive him of a Fellowship, but to give it to him when it would be of the greatest help to him. If you would place this letter with my former report so that the Committee will have both of them to consider, I am sure it would give an accurate picture of my feelings in the matter.
