A study of the small high schools among Negroes in Alabama. To what extent are the boys and girls who, for the most part, attend small high schools learning to meet the problems of contemporary life? I propose to make a normative survey of the small high schools of the State of Alabama and make recommendations to the respective boards of education and other school officials.
