



Dear Supt. Rhoads:

Just before leaving the office for a vacation trip of several weeks Mr. Rosenwald authorized me by letter to make up a budget for schoolhouse construction in the various southern states, keeping the total within the limit of \$450,000. This amount does not include the RESERVE FUND for emergencies in construction, which will be determined on his return to the office sometime between now and July 1st, nor does it include the administrative expenses. When these are added, the total budget for 1924-25 will doubtless be a half million dollars or more.

In keeping with this authorization and request of Mr. Rosenwald, I have carefully prepared a budget for the various states, beging guided largely by (a) the request from the states (b) the number of projects approved and completed on the present year's budget and (c) the number and size of projects I felt that each state could provide funds for and adequately supervise the construction of for the year beginning July 1, 1924, and ending June 30, 1925. 
