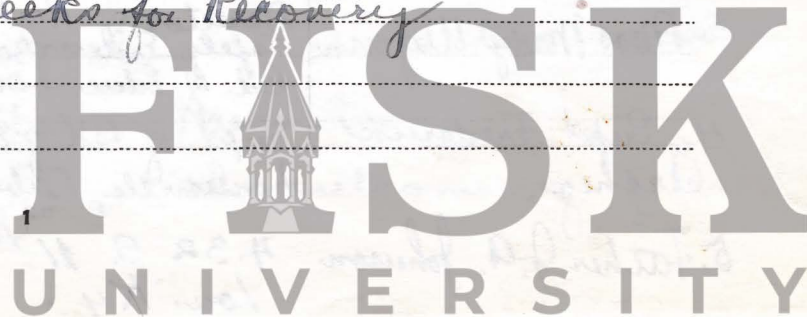

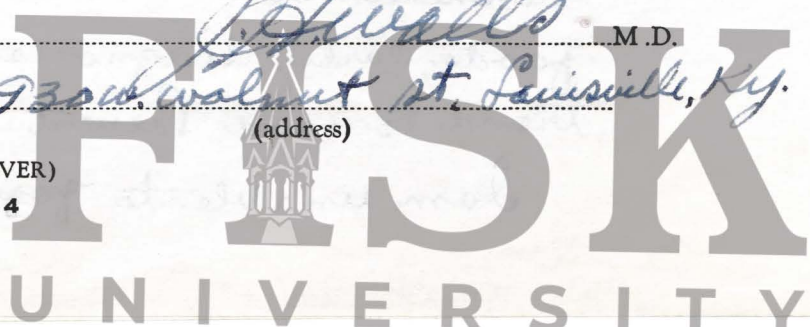

Please restrict essay to pages five and six.

For the past five years I have been engaged as Health Counselor in the Secondary schools in Louisville, Ky. Such work has brought before me problems which have lead me to believe that, should I have wider experience and training, to broaden my scope, so as to include the Community; I would be able to help solve more satisfactorily many of the major problems with which I come in contact; as these problems at their source, are reflections of the Community's at large.

Being in the south my work has been limited to Negroes, which gives our Community health problem a definite racial slant. Work in other Communities has been proven to benefit by Negro workers among their own group, therefore if I am able to so develop myself, I will have that advantage in this or any similar Community.

One of the major problems as I see it, is to get people to realize the seriousness of what they call minor ailments and the result of their neglect. This is especially noticeable in the fields of Tuberculosis and Venereal Diseases. In addition to this we are all aware of the apparent need for provoking a community health consciousness in the inestimable values of cleanliness and sanitation, foods, early diagnosis etc., which is the modern trend toward Preventative Medicine.

I am unable to foresee the outcome of these

problems, without efficient and well trained workers with the kind of interest and ability, to not only investigate what has been done in ~~with~~ connection with, but to project a plan of study and procedure that will lead directly to the solution of the same.

In view of these facts, I feel an adaptation to, and interest in the field of Public Health in which, if especially prepared, I believe I shall be able to contribute helpfully.
