Dear sir:

I am writing to make application for a grant to pursue a course of study in Neurology and Psychiatry.

There has been assigned me work leading to advanced training in Neurology at The Neurological Institute of New York; but on account of lack of funds, I am unable to pursue the course, unless there can be obtained financial assistance. Upon the completion of this course, my services will be used by the North Carolina Health Department in connection with Negro health work; and also as a member of the teaching staff of one of the hospitals for Negroes. This type of work is much needed in the South, particularly in North Carolina.

Letters of information relative to this matter will be forwarded from the North Carolina Health Department and Dr. Lloyd J. Thompson, Director of the North Carolina Commission for the Study of the Care of the Insane and Mental Defectives, Duke Hospital, Durham, North Carolina.
