Dear Dr. Bousfield: Several months ago I wrote you seeking information concerning the possibility of securing a scholarship or fellowship grant to aid me in pursuing work in the field of public health. Your reply insisted that I receive an M.D. degree. I appreciate the fact that a medical degree will be of great value to me in future health work and hence am including as many medical courses in my program as possible. However, I plan to include education and sociology in my curriculum because I believe that in the near future public health training will be incorporated in our schools. It is my opinion that with a bit of encouragement and persuasion the unit of institutions in Atlanta, Georgia may include such work in their programs.

I have been in conference with a member of the faculty of the school of hygiene and public health here at the University of Michigan who is aiding me in formulating a program of study that will be of value to me and my race. When the program is completed I will send you a copy if you will be interested so that you may offer suggestions to better it.

Will you please inform me whether or not I may expect any ~~con~~ consideration as a candidate for assistance in spite of the lack of medical training.
