The number of one-teacher schools is the maximum on which the Fund will give aid the next budget year, and the number of two-teacher schools cannot be exceeded without special authorization by the officers of the Fund. In keeping with modern trends of education the Fund desires to concentrate more and more in the larger consolidated schools.

In order to stimulate the construction of more permanent buildings the Fund has increased its allotment \$50.00 per classroom for
brick vensor, solid brick, or satisfactory concrete construction, as
shown above in the last column, the maximum for a ten-teacher or larger
being \$2,600. We now have a complete set of plans worked out in detail
for brick vensor construction from a three-teacher to a ten-teacher
type, which will be furnished the State Department as needed.

For the present budget year the Fund is giving aid on two types of shops - a one-room (\$200) and a two-room (\$400). Because of urgent demands from some of the states it was thought best to increase this

this aid for 1928-29 to \$600. for a three-room shop to include facilities for home economics in the larger vocational schools. Plans for a three-room shop have been worked out in tentative form and will be adjusted to suit the needs of the schools to be served.

As the average term of the schools on which the Fund is giving aid the present year is more than six months, it has been decided to increase the minimum requirement for next year from five months to six months.

Please let me take this opportunity in behalf of the officers and Trustees of the Fund to thank you and your staff for your hearty cooperation and to assure you of our interest in every phase of progress in the education system of your State. When we can serve you, command us.

Dear Mr. Smith:

I am sending you our application for 1929-30 budget which we have made very conservative because of the unfortunate financial situation which is facing us at present. Since we have failed to use our present budget we feel that the amount shown represents all that we should ask for. I have not made any application for term extension or for transportation of pupils.

Under present conditions it would be almost impossible for us to get any county to go into this term extension. There is a disposition on the part of the counties to maintain the schools seven months where the attendance will justify such a term, but the condition of \$50.00 a month salary would prevent the counties that need this money from taking up the proposition. In some of our schools where we have teachers paid \$1,200.00 a year there are other teachers who get only \$40.00 a month.

It is impossible for us to take up in a serious way the question of transportation of pupils.

It seems that the balance of our present budget not covered by applications will have to revert. If you could give us until April 1st to file applications I believe that I could get some more of this money taken up on schools that will actually be built between now and June 1st. I lost a good deal of time in February on account of being sick.
