Dear Dr. Bousfield:

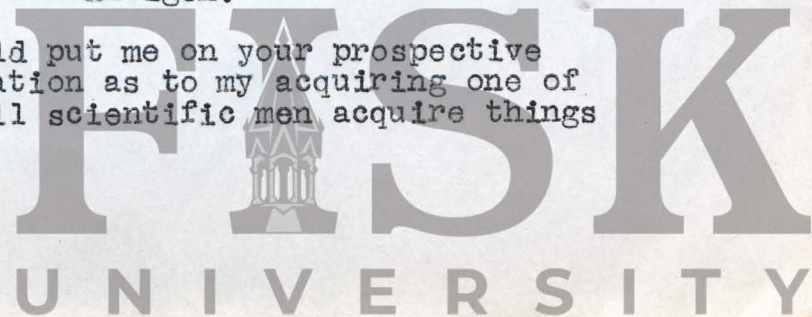
I am enclosing a copy of a letter which I have received from the Punjab Medical Journal of India. This letter was written as a result of my work on Granuloma, the article which appeared in the August 1938 issue of the Journal of the National Medical Association.

I am still working on this problem, and have recently demonstrated an initial lesion of Granuloma Inguinale, which I missed at first as it appeared as a simple folliculitis in the pubic hair, but on later development it became ulcerated, with the deep silver stain showing the Donovan Bodies as well as the clinical improvement from the use of Tartar Emetic and Fuadin, all proving this case to be one of Granuloma Inguinale.

A year or so ago I asked you to use your good offices to get me a Fellowship for a post-graduate study. At that time you felt that New York men, with their facilities, did not need the same. I still am desirous of acquiring such a Fellowship, and feel that if I could devote a year to the study of both Granuloma Inguinale and Lymphogranuloma, it would be a benefit to the medical profession.

At present I am about to publish 12 cases of Lymphogranuloma, showing micro-photographs of the treatment six months before and after, of the pathological lesion, with the use of Frei Antigen.

I wish you would put me on your prospective file for future consideration as to my acquiring one of these Fellowships, for all scientific men acquire things


