CAREER SINCE TENURE OF FELLOWSHIP

9/25/40 Plans for Mr. Black's return to the University of Arkansas could not be worked out at the beginning of the 1940 academic year, so he accepted a post as professor of biology and chemistry at the Anderson College and Theological Seminary, Anderson, Indiana. His writing program is being actively continued.

4/20/41 In the spring of 1941 the American Philosophical Society of Philadelphia made Mr. Black a grant of \$100 to purchase maps and mapping equipment to be used in further study of Arkansas fishes.

Hopes to work out Ark connections.

9/27/44: Biologist, Wisconsin Conservation Department. Is doing research on fishes of the Madison Lakes, especially the carp and its relationships to game fishes. Also serving as state taxonomist (fishes) and will gradually shift main activities toward a taxonomic and ecological study of Wisconsin fishes. Has been serving as guest lecturer in fish courses at University of Wisconsin.
