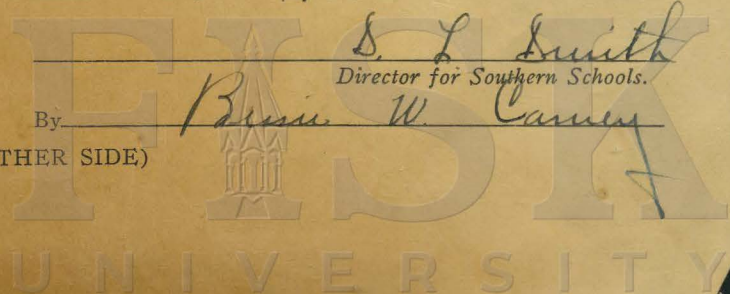

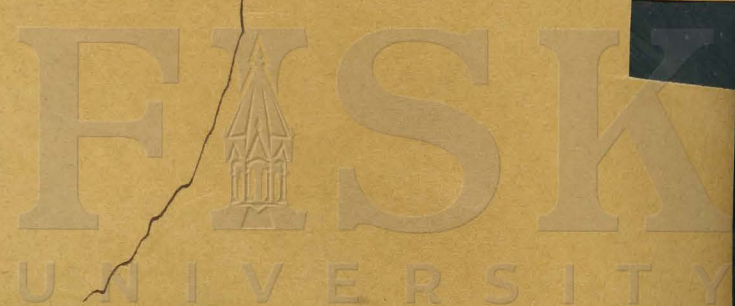

DESCRIPTION OF BUSES

High School- Chevrolet chassis, enclosed body, rear door controlled from driver's seat to be opened in case of emergency, pupils are loaded from the front and unloaded the same way. This bus was inspected July 3, 1931 and at regular intervals thereafter.

Elementary - Ford, one and one-half ton chassis, thirty-five pupil capacity, same arrangement on doors as above, and was inspected July 3, 1931. Both of these busses are painted maroon with four inch aluminum letters reading "Hamilton County School Bus", this being our requirement of all school busses.
