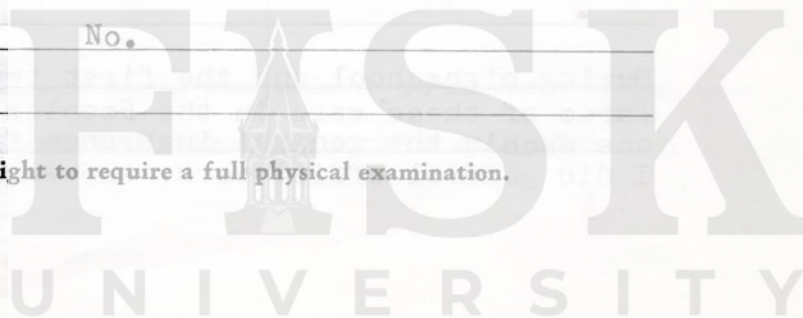

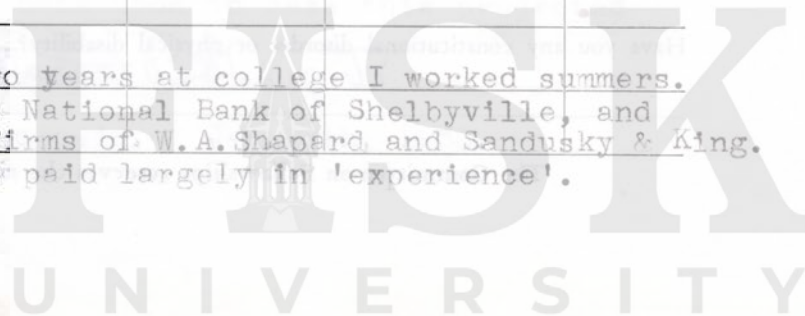

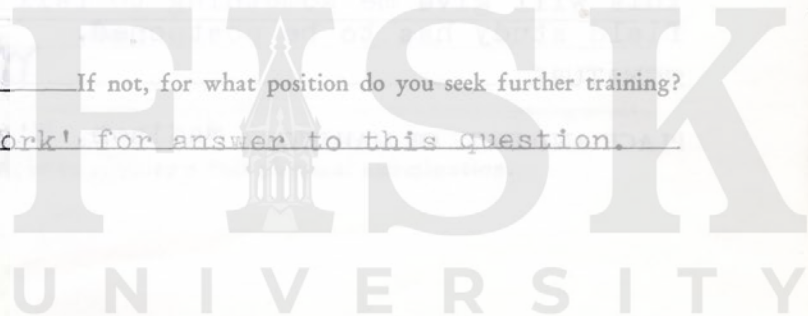

FELLOWSHIPS HELD

Vanderbilt University:

I held a Wall Scholarship in 1931-32 and again in 1933-34. The stipend was \$300. for the academic year. At this time I was working on a B.A. and was majoring in English Literature.

I held a University Fellowship paying \$300. during 1935-36 while I was working on an M.A. in Sociology.

University of Wisconsin:

Last year (1936-37) and again this year I have received a University Fellowship. The stipend is \$600. and exemption from out of state tuition. I am working for a Ph.D. in the Department of Sociology, majoring in Rural under Prof. John H. Kolb.
