Dear Mr. Beech: May I please have your vote on the following extension grants which I discussed with the other members of the Fellowship Committee in Nashville last week end.

Mr. B. R. Brazeal has applied for a supplemental grant of \$1,200 to enable him to complete his interviews and research on the FEPC study started on his 1946 fellowship. Mr. Charles H. Houston and Miss Sara Southall have recommended that the Fund make this grant.

Mr. L. Howard Bennett, on leave from the American Council on Race Relations, who was awarded a fellowship in 1946 to get his M.A. in public administration is now attending the Law School of the University of Chicago. He has asked that beginning January, 1948 a grant of \$5,000 be made available to him over a 24 months period to enable him to complete his study in public law. This is the second phase of Mr. Bennett's plan of work submitted in support of his 1946 fellowship. His broad background in the social sciences affords him a thorough understanding of the social implications of the law, and he feels that with this combination he can be most effective in a career of public service.

Will you let me know whether you approve granting these extensions? All other members of the Committee have voted in the affirmative.
