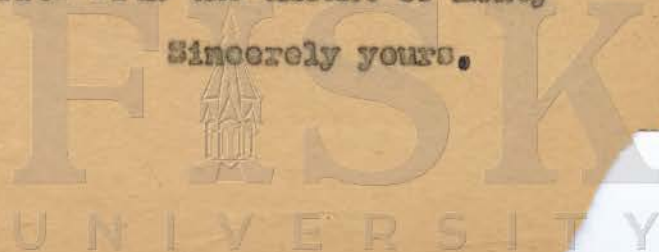
The aid for schools and additions above a six-teacher type - seven-teacher to ten-teacher, inclusive - is for county training schools or county high schools striving to meet state requirements for high school standardization. Copies of the detailed plan for distribution of aid will be mailed within a few days.

Beginning July 1, 1927 the Fund agrees to give aid for shops on condition that (a) the building be erected according to plans and specifications furnished or approved by the Fund, (b) an ample supply of tools be purchased, and (c) a trained teacher be provided to take charge of the work.

1 RURAL SCHOOL LIBRARY-

20 libraries on same basis as that of this year, with same list of books and the same plan of handling, the amount of aid by the Fund to be \$40 each, or a total of \$ 800.

2 VISITING LIBRARIAN-

Part of the traveling expenses of a trained librarian designated by the State Department of Education to visit the schools where these libraries are placed and give instructions on the organization, care and use of the books \$ 250

3 ROSENWALD SCHOOL DAY PROGRAM -

Amount for printing programs, etc., \$ 150

4 HIGH SCHOOL LIBRARY-

(If you desire aid on the purchase of an additional library with books suitable for high school grades, what size library would you suggest and how many would you likely need? Would the same plan as used in the Rural School Library be satisfactory, provided the list should be approved by all the State Departments? No definite decision or plan for this additional library has been agreed on by the officers of the Fund. The question is simply being raised to find out if there is a need and a desire for it.)

We have six to ten high schools where we could place such a library and I am sure the schools and officials would appreciate your assistance. I would suggest a library of similar size to the present rural school library.

busses at an average cost of \$ 1,000 each, ----- \$1,000,

(Do you feel that a county would agree to pay all the  
cost of transportation if the Fund should give half the cost  
of a bus, or would it be necessary to offer to pay a part of  
the operating expenses also?)

For the first year it would probably be necessary to help on the purchase
