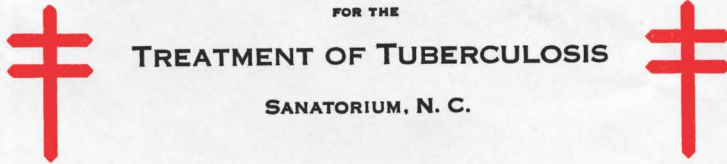

I understand that Dr. John Sinclair Perry is making application to you for a fellowship to pursue a course in neuropsychiatry at the New York Neurological Institute.

I have known Dr. Perry for the last ten years or more. He organized the Piedmont District Medical Society and he has taken an active interest in organized medicine and in improving the standards of medical practice among the Negro physicians of our State. He has also had an active interest in public health matters and has been one of the leaders in the efforts to improve health conditions among the colored people in his part of the State. He was among the first to advocate a sanatorium for Negro patients and has been interested in trying to lower the death rate among the Negro population.
