Will leave for Brazil soon after middle of July, ^{changes at Sept 10)} Will work in the National Archives in the Itamarati Palace in Rio de Janeiro. Some additional work may be done in Sao Paulo. 5/18/41

Arrived in Rio de Janeiro last week of September, 1941. "Before we return to the U. S. next summer we hope to be able to finance a trip to Montevideo and Buenos Aires. While that will not be a part of my academic pursuits here it would be of great value to me in my teaching and lecture work at home." 9/30/41
