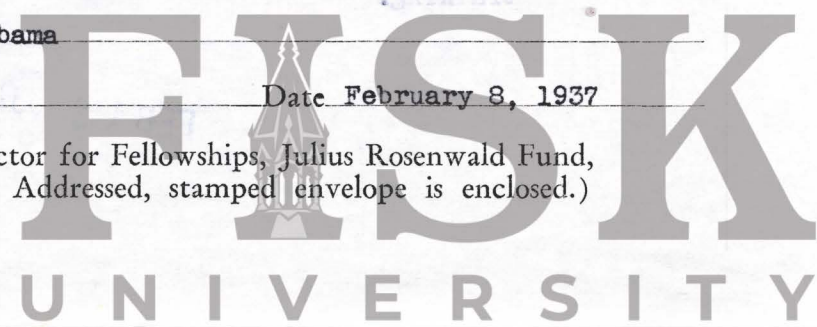

With regard to Miss Allouise Sympson Jaxon, the above named applicant, may I state that, it seems that there is an idea as to the addition of a course in Public Health leading toward a degree in this phase of nursing.
