I am continuing the study for which I came to Europe in May 1938 on the Rosenwald fellowship.

Additional information:

My original study of cooperative life insurance has developed into a study of the causes of the confusion in which the social institutions of a nation disintegrate. The confusion itself seems to be the expression of "dualism" which begins within the human individual, is transferred by him to the general society in which he lives, in the form of dualist attitudes, and from there finds its way into the institutional structure of the society in which he expresses himself in action.

This study has led into fields of human experience which lay far beyond the range of my comprehension at the time I came to Europe. During the last six weeks, I have been making quite unanticipated progress in the development of a synthesis of my findings. At present, I am summarizing this synthesis in a report which will be mailed to Julius Rosenwald Fund as soon as it is completed.
