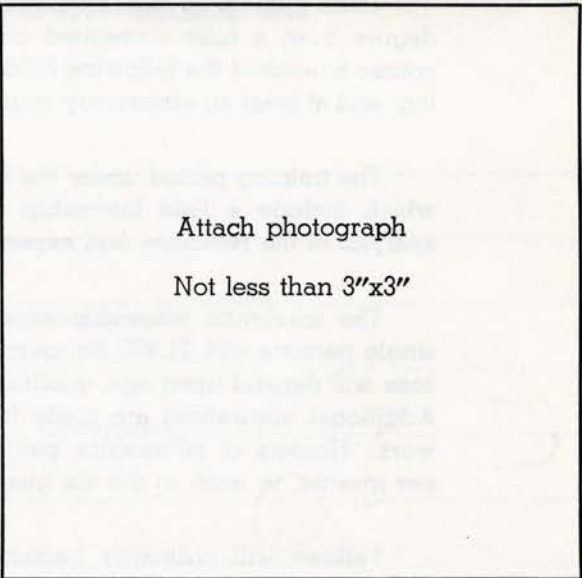

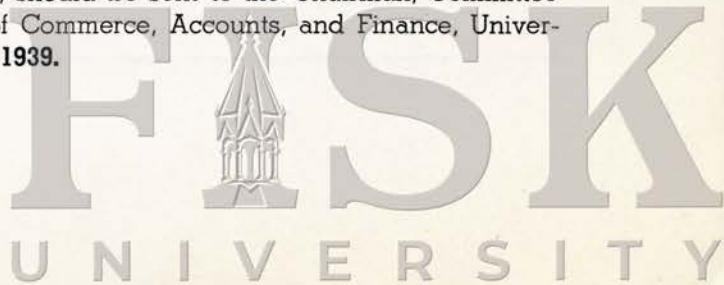

A fellowship may be withdrawn and the payment thereon terminated in case the work or the conduct of the recipient becomes, in the opinion of the Department of Government Management, prejudicial to the purpose for which the fellowships have been established.

This blank, completely filled out and complied with, should be sent to the Chairman, Committee on The Alfred P. Sloan Foundation Fellowships, School of Commerce, Accounts, and Finance, University of Denver, Denver, Colorado, **not later than March 15, 1939.**



NOTE: Applicants should carefully read the following before mailing application.

To be eligible for a fellowship the candidate must have at least a bachelor's degree from a fully accredited college. He must have completed a year's course in each of the following fields: political science, economics, and accounting; and at least an elementary course in statistics.*

The training period under the fellowships covers six consecutive quarters, which include a field internship on assignments for the investigation and analysis of the revenues and expenditures of selected local government units.

The maximum fellowship stipend per twelve-month period is \$1,200 for single persons and \$1,800 for married men. The amount determined in each case will depend upon age, qualifications and personal needs of the candidate. Additional allowances are made for transportation expense incurred in field work. Holders of fellowships pay the regular graduate tuition fee of \$75.00 per quarter, in each of the six quarters.

Fellows will ordinarily become candidates for the degree of Master of Science in Government Management at the University of Denver. In appropriate cases the candidate may work out a cooperative arrangement for the doctorate from the institution under which he has already pursued his graduate work.

*In exceptional cases candidates with an otherwise outstanding record may be accepted with a temporary deficiency in one of these fields, provided that the required courses to eliminate the deficiency will have been completed prior to the fall quarter in 1939.
