Dear Moe: I want first to thank you again for your great assistance at the Committee meeting. I do not know what we would do without you. Your contribution is of inestimable value.

I also want to thank you for handling the art and music cases through your juries. You will remember that I raised the question of honoraria last year, and I wish to raise it again. If you think it appropriate or desirable that we send checks to the juries, will you please tell me what would be the right amount so that I can handle this before I leave the Fund? In any case, I should like to write each person a letter of thanks, so I will appreciate your sending me names and addresses.

A letter from Nelson Rockefeller has come in response to my request that his committee consider a grant of \$1,250 to each of the two Fellows who are proposing work in Latin America. I refer to LeRoy Watson in forestry economics and to Leon F. Sensabaugh in history. Mr. Rockefeller says he is submitting ^{the same} to you for your consideration. If you think these men could be considered with the applications you are handling for him, funds could be released here for one or two others about whom we talked, but on whom we could not act because of lack of money. After you have had time to think this over, will you please write me here in order that adjustments can be made, if possible, in our lists?

When you are in Washington I hope you will look me up. I can be reached through the Department of Agriculture.
