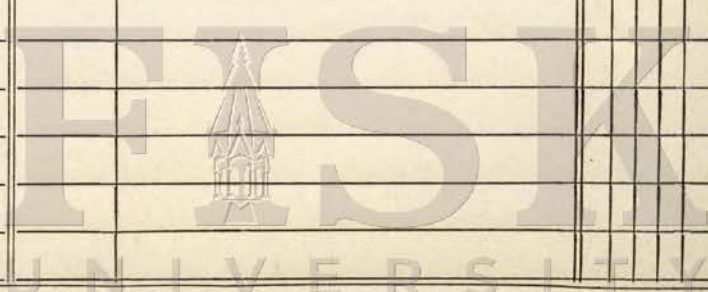

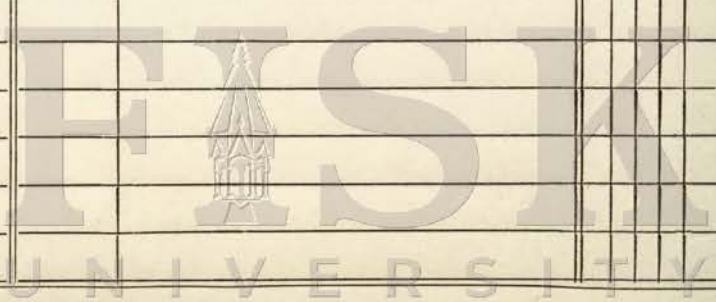

Dear Mr. Wale:

This letter is to bring to your attention the request for aid for William S. M. Banks to study agriculture and cooperative methods during the winter quarter.

Mr. Banks has gone over various possibilities and seems to feel that the University of Iowa would present the best possibilities in this direction. He is particularly attracted by a course listed there which consists of field trips to see agricultural enterprises, with special emphasis on cooperatives, in action. In addition, he will have an opportunity for living in a cooperative unit there.

This letter, then, is to request you, through the Fund, to make available, if at all possible, the sum of \$300.00 to finance the quarter of study for Mr. Banks at Iowa.

To remind you, let me say that Mr. Banks is a graduate of Dillard University with the degree of Bachelor of Arts. He graduated in Sociology at Fisk University in 1940 with the degree of Master of Arts. He has been the teacher of Agricultural Economics here since June, and, in that capacity, has also supervised both the construction and the operation of our first cooperative unit. More recently Mr. Banks has been busy in setting up a cooperative unit for the entire institution. And it is progressing very satisfactorily this year as compared to last year when we lacked such an intelligent and energetic person to promote the enterprise.

As Mr. Banks, as well as the rest of us here, <sup>is</sup> ~~are~~ anxious to make final plans for the disposition of his work and services during the winter quarter, I would greatly appreciate hearing from you at your earliest convenience.



Dear Mr. Wale:

This letter is to lay before you an application for aid to this Faculty for further study, in order that a well rounded program of in-service training may be carried out here, while, at the same time, we make use of the growing services of the persons so favored.

The first person listed is Mr. Lawrence A. Jones. Mr. Jones may be known to you as an outstanding and promising young artist. He is at the present time working on a mural here which is going ahead very rapidly, and which is, we believe, one of the best things of its sort that you could possibly see.

Mr. Jones plans to study in Mexico as soon as possible. We wish to help facilitate this effort where possible, and to make it possible for him to study from the Fifteenth of July to January 6th, if possible. We estimate that the cost for study for this period would be in the neighborhood of \$800.00. We therefore request your consideration of a possible grant to him in this amount.

Mr. W. S. M. Banks has served well here in connection with our Coop houses, and studied with success at the State University of Iowa in the Winter Quarter of 1941. In order that he may continue consecutively his study, we request a grant to him in the amount of \$300.00, for study during the Spring Quarter of 1942, at the State University of Iowa.

Mr. Wm. O'Shields has done well here, and we feel that under certain conditions further study will help both him and the institution. With Mr. O'Shields we face a possibility of attraction elsewhere by a larger salary. Mr. O'Shields has in process a study of posture which has aroused considerable interest. To enable him to pursue this study, we request your consideration of a grant to him in the amount of \$300.00, for study during the Winter Quarter of 1942, or from January 5-March 20th at the University of Minnesota.

Miss Allee James was originally scheduled to study during the Summer Session. The demands made upon her by the State Department of Vocational Education, however, have prevented this possibility. We now plan to permit Miss James to do this study, if possible, during the Winter Quarter of 1942. For this we respectfully request your consideration of an appropriation to her, for this purpose, of \$300.00.

Mr. E. J. Adkins is a very useful and effective member of our English Faculty. A graduate of Dillard and Fisk Universities, the further prosecution of advanced studies by him would be of considerable advantage to this institution and to him. For this reason we request your consideration of a grant for study for him during the Fall Quarter of 1941-1942, in the amount of \$200.00.

Her present plans to coincide with the plans of the institution call for advanced study by her at the University of Iowa during the Winter Quarter of 1942. We therefore respectfully solicit your consideration of a grant to her for this purpose in the amount of \$200.00.

Mr. W. H. Pipes, of our faculty, is now studying at the University of Michigan, where he has done very well. He plans now to complete his work for the doctorate at that institution in the Spring of 1942. We therefore request your consideration of a grant to him in the amount of \$200.00 to facilitate this endeavor.

A Mr. Shelton will probably be added to our faculty to take the place held open by Mr. Matthew Fairfax, who has just informed us that on account of a very attractive offer made to him in the public schools of Cincinnati, that he will not be able to be with us next year.

Mr. Shelton is a young man graduating this year from Tuskegee Institute. He is, however, a very able young man; and he seems to be the kind of person who may be depended upon to go ahead in the world. We would wish him to begin immediately to prepare himself for further advancement, even prior to joining our faculty in September. We therefore request the appropriation of \$250.00 to be used in sending Mr. Shelton to one of the better industrial arts institutions in further preparation for his work here.

Miss Inez D. Jenkins of our Faculty may be granted a Fellowship from the University of Chicago for study there this Summer. If this is not the case, we request consideration of a grant to her in the amount of the proposed Chicago fellowship, or \$300.00.

He does not state the amount that you had talked with him about, and I am wondering if it is the sum we included in our proposed schedule.

If you will write me a request for this by return mail, then my official reply to you will make it possible for Miss Elvidge to release the funds to Mr. O'Shields.

I am wondering if it would not be well for us to review the proposed schedule for the spring study. Can you see that far ahead at this time? If so, will you write me an official request for the people and the amount you feel they should have.

By the way, in looking over the plan as we made it out last spring, I notice that we had Lawrence Jones down for two quarters of study, presumably in Mexico, the fall and winter quarters of this year. We proposed to pay him \$400 for each quarter. I understand from Miss Elvidge that he has received a total of \$800, but a recent note from him says that he expects to be in Fort Valley in January. Would you not say

this was rather a liberal grant for such a short time in Mexico? Perhaps he has been able to retain enough of it to do further study in some other connection shortly. However, I shall rest that judgment with you.

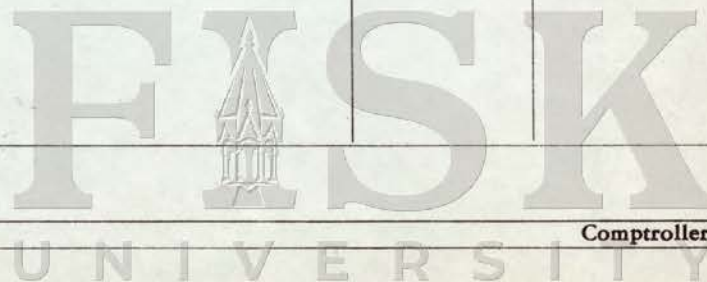

Dear Mr. Wale:

I am glad you raised the questions about the schedule of faculty study in your letter of December 29th. So many things have happened, and appear about to happen, that I quite agree with you that the original schedule in my letter of May 20th needs reconsideration. As you can understand, we figure only as far as our noses, in these days, and sometimes not that far.

Let me take these cases up one by one.

1. Mr. Jones. Mr. Jones was given \$800.00. This was originally intended to finance his study in Mexico for a full six months from July to January. Unfortunately, Mr. Jones also obligated himself to finish the mural he had started here. For this and other reasons, Mr. Jones did not get to Mexico until August.

I do feel that the amount for the time was very large, although, of course, travel was a considerable factor. When next I see Mr. Jones, I will be careful to pursue the possibility you mentioned, and report to you thereon.

I might add that Mr. Jones has recently been classified in 1-A according to recent revisions of the program.

2. Mr. O'Shields. The original agreement with Mr. O'Shields contemplated the provision of substitute service, and was based on other contingencies. At this time I feel that the situation would be met by a grant to Mr. O'Shields, if at all possible, to provide a small sum to meet differentials between his normal living cost by reason of his study at Minnesota. The proposed grant would be reduced from that proposed in my letter of May 20th to meet the following items:

Travel allowance, estimated at \$50.00.....	\$50.00
Tuition allowance, estimated at 20.00.....	20.00
Maintenance allowance (differential), estimated at \$30.00 monthly for three months.....	90.00

Total.....160.00

3. Miss Allee James. Here was also a case which has changed by nature of circumstances. The present status is that this person is studying at the University of Minnesota or is to study there under an agreement by which substitute service is to be provided at a cost of \$225.00. This money is to be paid to a substitute teacher, Miss Rosalie Jefferson, at the rate of \$75 monthly for three months, beginning (for January) on January 31st. I feel it would simplify matters if the checks could be drawn in favor of Rosalie Jefferson (on later instructions from us) on account of substitute work for Allee James.

- b. W. H. Pipes, listed in original letter of May 20th for a grant of \$200.00. Mr. Pipes has completed all of his residence work at Michigan, and had intended to use this amount, with absence from the campus allowed, to complete his work for his thesis.



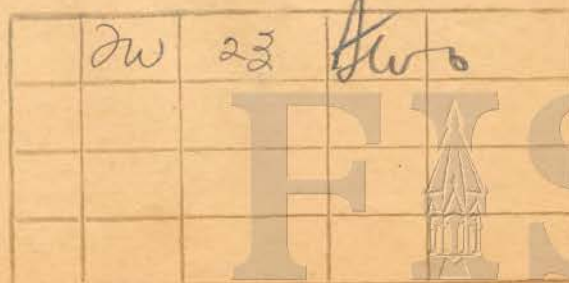

Dear Mr. Wale:

I wired you in Chicago on Monday, but learned that you were to be in Greensboro this week. Hence this letter.

Last week, after Miss Jenkins, my secretary for the first two years, this year our Counsellor of Women, resigned, I employed a young woman who has been working for Dr. Charles S. Johnson. On the appearance of this young woman Miss Jenkins confessed that she was bluffing, and had no intention of resigning, really; she had not thought that I would employ some one else.

I wired you in Chicago to ask you if it would be possible for the Fund to make a grant to this young woman for study purposes during the Spring and Summer quarters of 1942.

I would grant you that the young woman's action is an indication of stress. I spoke to you about her sometime ago. This stress has been aggravated by various circumstances concerned with the matter regarding which I spoke to you. She is only twenty-five years old, and has carried a considerable weight of responsibility here, and carried it very well. As Dean of Women, she has been obliged to live an Ungodly life for a young woman, and I can easily see why the strain of taking care of more than two hundred girls not much younger than she, of carrying a pretty heavy load of teaching, and the like, would depress anyone.

Now, I know that the Julius Rosenwald Fund exists neither to rescue college presidents from embarrassing situations, nor to rescue impetuous young woman from the embarrassments incident to their impetuosity. Yet I feel justified in recommending this young woman strongly for a grant under our teacher-education program for the reasons of her promise and for other reasons.

Among the other reasons are, (1), that she was given a grant of \$300.00 in the Summer of 1941, as you will remember, but it was not used because we got a Chicago fellowship for her. (2) Her brother, Fred Jenkins, had a junior Rosenwald fellowship this year, but went to the Army in November of 1941. (3) I am sure that this young woman has learned from this incident not to try to bluff a president in the future, and (4) the president has learned to deal gently or more so with good people who threaten him with resignations. Regarding No. 2, I know that the fellowships are not transferable, but I can assure you that there is equal promise in this case as with the brother, and the people at Chicago can tell you the same thing.

Our budget will permit us to use her in 1942-1943, but not until then. (Fall). The immediate situation of embarrassment is about over, but not the long-time situation of need. She is to go tonight to her home in Alexandria to await further word from me. Her address there is Box 602, Alexandria, La., in care of Mrs. M. M. Jenkins. For myself, On Wednesday I will be travelling northward by car, to be passing through Fayetteville State Teachers College Wednesday night, and

Dear Doctor Bond: I had a nice talk with Miss Jenkins yesterday. I agree with you that she is a superior young woman. And I think your suggestion that she come to the University of Chicago for these two quarters is an excellent solution to the problem.

I asked Miss Jenkins what her needs were and the amount she and you had decided upon. She said she had more or less left this up to you. I think she is preparing some statement of contemplated expenses for the next two quarters, which may give you some definite figures as to the amount of the grant. Will you, therefore, write me a letter requesting that a grant of such and such an amount be made to Miss Jenkins for study during the spring and summer quarters at the University of Chicago, in order that she may prepare herself for further service in personnel work at Fort Valley. I shall then write to you, after the board meeting when the funds for personnel development have been replenished. This letter of approval will come to you about April 15. At the same time a letter and check will go to Miss Jenkins here in Chicago.
