





Dear Mr. Wale: I regret very much to say that this letter is written to bring up a matter that should have been brought to your attention much before. I refer to the original scheme for personnel development for members of the faculty here which was the subject of correspondence between us last Spring. You will remember that this comprehensive scheme called for arranging periods of study during the year by various members of the faculty, with small grants allocated for this purpose. Under this arrangement, Mr. E. J. Adkins is presently studying at the Ohio State University, in English. Under the arrangement which made this possible. Miss E. Ursula Pollard, also of the English Department, was to go off the second quarter, and has made plans to study at the University of Minnesota. Mr. Adkins is to return during the Winter Quarter. In the Spring, Mr. Pipes is to be off. and during the Summer. Mr. T. B. O'Daniel. You will note that of the original grants, one to Shelton was not paid because Shelton informed me that he might be drafted; we got a deferment, and he is now here, but may be drafted nevertheless now. However, as I have informed Miss Elvidge, that grant is off the record. Likewise, the grant for Miss Jenkins was cancelled because she obtained a fellowship from the University of Chicago. The next quarter, Mr. O'Shields, of the Physical Education Department, has laid plans to go to Minnesota. Mr. Blanchet is to go to Michigan, without obligation so far as we are concerned in the way of a grant. The case of Miss Pollard is to the fore, however, and it is about her that I write at the present time. As I have mentioned, our assignments to teaching duties were predicated on letting each of the four English people off for one quarter each. in rotation; Adkins, first, Pollard, second, Pipes, third, and O'Daniel, fourth. The time has slipped by when I should have written you about Miss Pollard's approaching absence. She is leaving this afternoon for Christmas vacation and for entry at Minnesota after the holidays. I am therefore writing you in haste, with the great hope that after reviewing the original prospectus regarding the allotments for faculty study, you may be able to have Miss Elvidge send a check to Miss Pollard, in care of the Bursar, with directions to hold for Miss Pollard's registration, by the time the Winter Quarter opens at Minnesotaon January 3 or thereabouts.

Dear Mr. Wale: I regret very much to say that this letter is written to bring up a matter that should have been brought to your attention much before. I refer to the original scheme for personnel development for members of the faculty here which was the subject of correspondence between us last Spring. You will remember that this comprehensive scheme called for arranging periods of study during the year by various members of the faculty, with small grants allocated for this purpose. Under this arrangement, Mr. E. J. Adkins is presently studying at the Ohio State University, in English. Under the arrangement which made this possible, Miss E. Ursula Pollard, also of the English Department, was to go off the second quarter, and has made plans to study at the University of Minnesota. Mr. Adkins is to return during the Winter Quarter. In the Spring, Mr. Pipes is to be off, and during the Summer, Mr. T. B. O'Daniel. You will note that of the original grants, one to Shelton was not paid because Shelton informed me that he might be drafted; we got a deferment, and he is now here, but may be drafted nevertheless now. However, as I have informed Miss Elvidge, that grant is off the record. Likewise, the grant for Miss Jenkins was cancelled because she obtained a fellowship from the University of Chicago. The next quarter, Mr. O'Shields, of the Physical Education Department, has laid plans to go to Minnesota. Mr. Blanchet is to go to Michigan, without obligation so far as we are concerned in the way of a grant. . The case of Miss Pollard is to the fore, however, and it is about her that I write at the present time. As I have mentioned, our assignments to teaching duties were predicated on letting each of the four English people off for one quarter each, in rotation; Adkins, first, Pollard, second, Pipes, third, and O'Daniel, fourth. The time has slipped by when I should have written you about Miss Pollard's approaching absence. She is leaving this afternoon for Christmas vacation and for entry at Minnesota after the holidays. I am therefore writing you in haste, with the great hope that after reviewing the original prospectus regarding the allotments for faculty study, you may be able to have Miss Elvidge send a check to Miss Pollard, in care of the Bursar, with directions to hold for Miss Pollard's registration, by the time the Winter Cuarter opens at Minnesotaen January 3 or thereabouts.

I deeply regret my delay in this matter in clearing these matters with you. However, as the original correspondence and plans were laid last May, and so much has happened since then, I really let this matter slip up on me, I hope not to your inconvenience, or to that especially of Miss Pollard.

Perhaps I have already informed you that the General Education Board did give Mr. Harrison a fellowship, under which he is studying at Ohio State. This, of course, further cancels from the record any request concerning him.

We are glad to hear that Mr. Harrison has been able to carry on his study at Ohio State University with funds from the General Education Board.

You will be interested that my brotherin-law, Robert MacGregor, wrote me last week that he had recently made the acquaintance of Laurence Jones in Mexico City and that he thought him an unusually fine person. I shall be interested in hearing your feeling about the value of this Mexican trip to Mr. Jones.

I have written Mr. Corry of Greene County that his suggestion concerning internship of Fort Valley students in Greene County has been turned over to you. I should like very much to know your feeling in this matter, whether it is going to be possible. I would, of course, think it wise, now, that you take the matter up directly with him rather than through me - a roundabout way and not at all necessary. I believe you will find him cooperative.

My plans are to be in Georgia later in January when I shall drop by Fort Valley for a day.

Dear Doctor Bond: I have sent you a telegram this morning in answer to your letter of December 23. I hope I have not misinterpreted the facts, but I am sure that Mr. Corry meant to have you send him internes for the elementary schools. By now, however, you will know.

As I wrote you last week, we have approved the grant of \$200 to Miss Pollard and are sending her check off to the University of Minnesota, as directed. Your letter speaks of Mr. O'Shields' going to the University of Minnesota this winter also, but does not ask for assistance for him. We had included him in our proposed schedule for faculty study which we made out last spring. I had not, however, written an official let or of approval to you which would earmark the grant. Today we received a letter from Mr. O'Shields asking that his grant be sent to him in Minnesota. He does not state the amount that you had talked with him about, and I am wondering if it is the sum we included in our proposed schedule.

If you will write me a request for this by return mail, then my official reply to you will make it possible for Miss Elvidge to release the funds to Mr. O'Shields.

I am wondering if it would not be well for us to review the proposed schedule for the spring study. Can you see that far shead at this time? If so, will you write me an official request for the people and the amount you feel they should have.

By the way, in looking over the plan as we made it out last spring, I notice that we had Lawrence Jones down for two quarters of study, presumably in Mexico, the fall and winter quarters of this year. We proposed to pay him \$400 for each quarter. I understand from Miss Elvidge that he has received a total of \$800, but a recent note from him says that he expects to be in Fort Valley in January. Would you not say

this was rather a liberal grant for such a short time in Mexico? Perhaps he has been able to retain enough of it to do further study in some other connection shortly. However, I shall rest that judgment with you.

Dear Mr. Wale: I am glad you raised the questions about the schedule of faculty study in your letter of December 29th. So many things have happened, and appear about to happen, that I quite agree with you that the original schedule in my letter of May 20th needs reconsideration. As you can understand, we figure only as far as our noses, in these days, and sometimes not that far. Let me take these cases up one by one. 1. Mr. Jones. Mr. Jones was given \$800.00. This was originally intended to finance his study in Mexico for a full six months from July to January. Unfortunately, Mr. Jones also obligated himself to finish the mural he had started here. For this and other reasons, Mr. Jones did not get to Mexico until August. I do feel that the amount for the time was very large, although, of course, travel was a considerable factor. When next I see Mr. Jones, I will be careful to pursue the possibility you mentioned, and report to you thereon. I might add that Mr. Jones has recently been classified in 1-A according to recent revisions of the program. 2. Mr. O'Shields. The original agreement with Mr. O'Shields contemplated the provision of substitute service, and was based on other contingencies. At this time I feel that the situation would be met by a grant to Mr. O'Shields, if at all possible, to provide a small sum to meet differentials between his normal living cost by reason of his study at Minnesota. The proposed grant would be reduced from that proposed in my letter of May 20th to meet the following items: Travel allowance, estimated at \$50.00.....\$50.00 Tuition allowance, estimated at 20.00...... 20.00 Maintenance allowance (differential), estimated at \$30.00 monthly for three months..... 90.00

3. Miss Allee James. Here was also a case which has changed by nature of circumstances. The present status is that this person is studying at the University of Minnesota or is to study there under an agreement by which substitute service is to be provided at a cost of \$225.00. This month is to be paid to a substitute teacher, Miss Rosalie Jefferson, at the rate of \$75 monthly for three months, beginning (for January) on January 31st. I feel it would simplify matters if the checks could be drawn in favor of Rosalie Jefferson (on later instructions from us) on account of substitute work for Allee James.

#### 4. Spring, 1942:

- a. W. S. M. Banks, listed in original letter of May 20th for a grant of \$300.00. Mr. Banks is listed as 1-A through recent selective service registration, and is likely to be called to service at any time. I therefore recommend cancellation of this request.
- b. W. H. Pipes, listed in original letter of May 20th for a grant of \$200.00. Mr. Pipes has completed all of his residence work at Michigan, and had intended to use this amount, with absence from the campus allowed, to complete his work for his thesis.

Since at the present time the English teachers will apparently be intact, I would still like to have this proposed grant kept in consideration, for disposal later on the basis of what might happen.

I hope I have covered the outstanding matters satisfactorily in this letter. I understand, of course, that all and any plans are subject to revision at a moment's notice. More detail of this will be provided in another letter.





Dear Mr. Wale:

I wired you in Chicago on Monday, but learned that you were to be in Greensboro this week. Hence this letter.

Last week, after Miss Jenkins, my secretary for the first two years, this year our Counsellor of Women, resigned, I employed a young woman who has been working for Dr. Charles S. Johnson. On the appearance of this young woman Miss Jenkins confessed that she was bluffing, and had no intention of resigning, really; she had not thought that I would employ some one else.

I wired you in Chicago to ask you if it would be possible for the Fund to make a grant to this young woman for study purposes during the Spring and Summer quarters of 1942.

I would grant you that the young woman's action is an indication of stress. I spoke to you about her sometime ago. This stress has been aggravated by various circumstances concerned with the matter regarding which I spoke to you. She is only twenty-five years old, and has carried a considerable weight of responsibility here, and carried it very well. As Dean of Women, she has been obliged to live an Ungodly life for a young woman, and I can easily see why the strain of taking care of more than two hundred girls not much younger than she, of carfying a pretty heavy load of teaching, and the like, would depress anyone.

Now, I know that the Julius Rosenwald Fund exists neither to rescue college presidents from embarassing situations, nor to rescue impetuous young woman from the embarassments incident to their impetuosity. Yet I feel justified in recommending this young woman strongly for a grant under our teacher-education program for the reasons of her promise and for other reasons.

Among the other reasons are, (1), that she was given a grant of \$300.00 in the Summer of 1941, as you will remember, but it was not used because we got a Chicago fellowship for her. (2) Her brother, Fred Jenkins, had a junior Rosenwald fellowship this year, but went to the Army in November of 1941. (3) I am sure that this young woman has learned from this incident not to try to bluff a president in the future, and (4) the president has learned to deal gently or more so with good people who threaten him with resignations. Regarding No. 2, I know that the fellowships are not transferable, but I can assure you that there is equal promise in this case as with the brother, and the people at Chicago can tell you the same thing.

Our budget will permit us to use her in 1942-1943, but not until then. (Fall). The immediate situation of embarassment is about over, but not the long-time situation of need, She is to go tonight to her home in Alexandria to await further word from me. Her address there is Box 602, Alexandria, La., in care of Mrs.

M. M. Jenkins. For myself, On Wednesday I will be travelling northward by car, to be passing through Fayetteville State Teachers College Wednesday night, and

Dear Doctor Bond: I had a nice talk with Miss Jenkins yesterday. I agree with you that she is a superior young woman. And I think your suggestion that she come to the University of Chicago for these two quarters is an excellent solution to the problem.

I asked Miss Jenkins what her needs were and the amount she and you had decided upon. She said she had more or less left this up to you. I think she is preparing some statement of contemplated expenses for the next two quarters, which may give you some definite figure as to the amount of the grant. Will you, therefore, write me a letter requesting that a grant of such and such an amount be made to Miss Jenkins for study during the spring and summer quarters at the University of Chicago, in order that she may prepare herself for further service in personnel work at Fort Valley. I shall then write to you, after the board meeting when the funds for personnel development have been replenished. This letter of approval will come to you about April 15. At the same time a letter and check will go to Miss Jenkins here in Chicago.

I shall be coming South after the board meeting, and as I told you on the telephone, I hope to drop by Fort Valley for a couple of days. I don't know the exact dates now but will let you know before I arrive.
