Dear Dr. Perry: Thanks very much for the interesting report you have made in your questionnaire. I am slightly surprised to find you in Washington as I had certainly thought you were still in North Carolina.

I regret that there is no change in the attitude of the Fund with reference to your request for a scholarship. This in no sense reflects upon your qualifications. It simply means that our trustees have given very specific directions as to the granting of scholarships. We are confined in almost every instance to granting assistance to persons in public health who are assured of permanent positions, or to persons who are attached to the staffs of institutions where their special training would add to the value of the work. I regret that the small amount of funds at our disposal makes it necessary to interpret these instructions very literally.

I hope I may have the pleasure of seeing you in Philadelphia during the meeting of the National Medical Association.
