LUCIUS N. LITTAUER FELLOWSHIPS

Candidates for these fellowships should have completed one or more years of graduate study in the social sciences. Practical experience in the government service will be considered a positive asset. Under the plans of the School, students are enabled to work out individual programs of study. These may be concentrated in one of the social sciences, particularly economics or political science, or they may combine two or more fields in a manner suitable to the needs of the particular student. Programs should also include one or more of the advanced seminars offered by the School.

The annual awards of fellowships are normally made for the term beginning September 22 and carry stipends up to \$1,500.

ADMINISTRATION FELLOWSHIPS

These fellowships are offered to recent college graduates who plan to enter the government service as a career or to persons now holding government positions whose experience or graduate study is not sufficient to qualify them for a Littauer fellowship. Previous graduate work or government experience is not a prerequisite for these fellowships, but they are regarded as assets. A keen determination to enter the government service is essential.

Applicants should have a B.A. degree or its equivalent, or anticipate the award of a degree not later than September 1, 1947. As in the case of the Littauer fellowships, the annual awards of fellowships are normally made for the term beginning September 23. Administration fellowships carry stipends up to \$1,000.

ADMISSION ON A TUITION BASIS

Students who desire to study at the School may be admitted on a tuition basis provided they possess the same general qualifications as the Fellows. Tuition at the School is \$200 per term.

VETERANS APPLICATIONS

Veterans seeking admission to the School or applying for fellowship aid should write to procure application forms. In this way each applicant will submit a full statement of his previous training and experience together with a transcript of his prior academic work. It is important for the applicant to set forth in some detail the nature of his work in the government service whether in the Army or Navy or in civilian agencies before entering or after leaving the armed forces.

ADMISSION OF WOMEN

The Governing Boards of Harvard College in the spring of 1943 voted to open the fellowships of the Graduate School of Public Administration to women who have had administrative experience and to admit such students as candidates for the degrees of the School.

DEGREES

Fellows may become candidates for the degree of Master in Public Administration or of Doctor of Public Administration, or they may work for advanced degrees in the University, such as the Ph.D. in Economics or Political Science or the joint degree in Political Economy and Government.
