University Fellowships

A limited number of fellowships, ranging from an annual value of \$500 to \$1,000, are offered to specially qualified graduate students who are candidates for higher degrees from New York University. These fellowships are available in any one of the following fields of study of the Graduate School: American Civilization, Biological Sciences, Chemistry, Classical Languages and Archaeology, Economics, English, Fine Arts, German, Government, History, Mathematics, Music, Philosophy, Physics, Psychology, Public Affairs and Regional Studies, Romance Languages, and Sociology.

Penfield Scholarships

FOR STUDIES IN DIPLOMACY, INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS, AND BELLES-LETTRES. By the will of Frederick Courtland Penfield, New York University received a fund of \$80,000, the income of which is used to maintain fellowships for studies in diplomacy, international affairs, and belles-lettres. For the coming year these fellowships will be of a maximum value of \$1,000 each. It is preferred, although not required, that applicants for these awards have to their credit at least one full year of graduate work.

All credentials in support of applications for any of the above awards should be on file in the office of the dean of the Graduate School not later than March 1, 1948.
