My dear Mr. Smith:

We are all very much pleased at the results of the first Rosenwald Day Program, which was put on in the State during the spring, and I am sincerely grateful to you and the Fund for allowing us \$100.00 with which to have the programs printed. However, we have used only \$35.46 of this amount and I am instructing our Auditor to return the unused balance, which is \$64.54, to the Fund.

The tabulation of the reports from the various schools shows the following interesting items:




