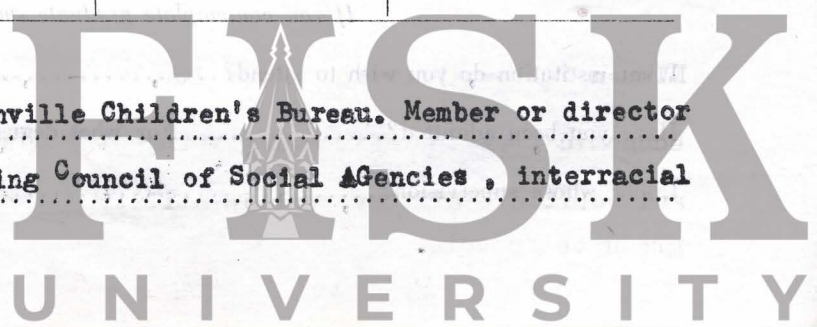

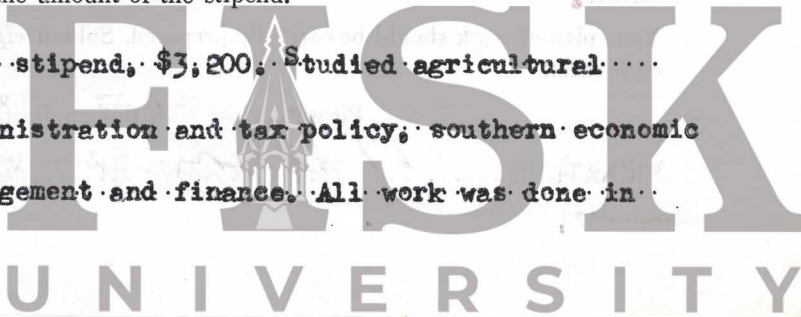
opportunity to examine racial problems in Honolulu, Shanghai, and other cities in the Pacific islands and the orient.

Statement of Plan of Work
