Dear Miss Dudley: I have this morning received a letter from Superintendent Archer of the Louisville Public Schools, copy of which came to you, which seems to indicate that you have already been granted a leave of absence in order to continue your studies.

I sincerely hope that this leave of absence was not taken with the feeling that there is a certainty of a scholarship from the Rosenwald Fund. The acceptance of an application for scholarship simply means that your application will be considered along with others at such time as the Scholarship Committee meets. It is utterly impossible to anticipate the action of such a committee as there are always many more applications than available funds. At the present time, the Committee has not set a date for meeting, and I feel quite certain that no action will be taken in time to permit summer work.
