REPORT OF ROSENWALD DAY OBSERVANCE IN TENNESSEE

1932

It is gratifying to know that Rosenwald Day was observed in many more schools in Tennessee in 1932 than ever before.

375 schools in 49 counties reported. Teachers taking part numbered 838; pupils numbered 32,895; patrons numbered 11,206; money raised during the day amounted to \$1,135.57; money raised during the year amounted to \$13,374.38.

The Carthage Colored School, in Smith County, of which Prof. J. H. Baird is principal, deserves special mention as having raised the largest amount of money on Rosenwald Day. The amount raised was \$174.50.

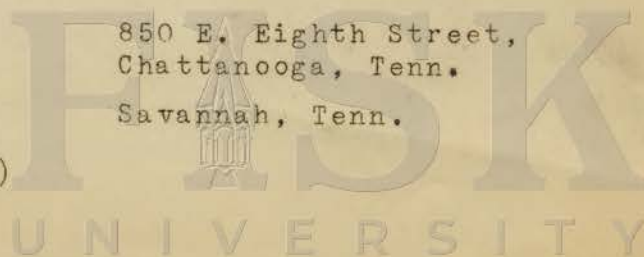

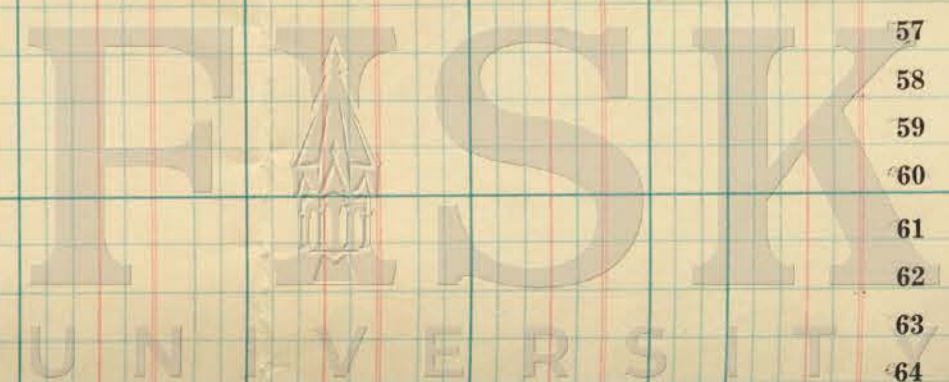

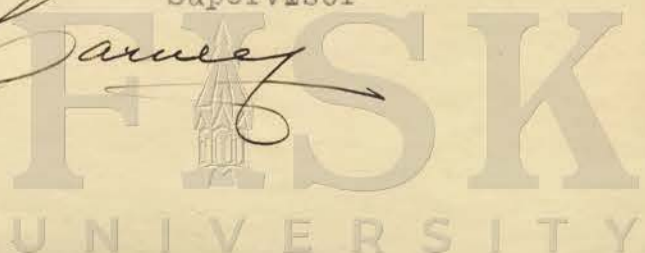
