We desire aid on the following items for the year 1929-30:

1 RURAL SCHOOL LIBRARY-

15 libraries on same basis as that of this year, with same list of books and the same plan of handling, the amount of aid by the Fund to be \$40 each, or a total of \$ 600.

2 VISITING LIBRARIAN-

Part of the traveling expenses of a trained librarian designated by the State Department of Education to visit the schools where these libraries are placed and give instructions on the organization, care and use of the books \$ 250.

3 ROSENWALD SCHOOL DAY PROGRAM -

Amount for printing programs, etc., \$ 100

4 HIGH SCHOOL LIBRARY-

(If you desire aid on the purchase of an additional library with books suitable for high school grades, what size library would you suggest and how many would you likely need? Would the same plan as used in the Rural School Library be satisfactory, provided the list should be approved by all the State Departments? No definite decision or plan for this additional library has been agreed on by the officers of the Fund. The question is simply being raised to find out if there is a need and a desire for it.)

Dear Sir:

We desire to make application for aid on the following projects
for the year 1929-30:

1 TERM EXTENSION-

One-half salaries of 50 teachers in 10 schools
\$2000, with the understanding that the Fund will pay one
dollar for one the first year, one for two the second year,
and one for three the third year for an extension of one
month or two months, on condition that no salary on which
aid is given is to be less than \$50, and further that the
county will agree to continue such extension without aid
after the third year. (Do not include in this request any
part of salaries of teachers on which aid is given the
present year.)

2 TRANSPORTATION OF PUPILS-

(a) One-half the cost of operating 1 auto transportation
busses an average of 9 months at \$ 100 per month \$ 900,
with the understanding that the Fund will give one dollar for
one the first year, one for two the second year, and one for
three the third year, and that the county will pay the remainder
each year and will agree to continue these busses without aid
after the third year

OR, where the county desires to purchase busses,

(b) One-half the cost of purchasing new transportation
busses at an average cost of \$ each, ----- \$.

(Do you feel that a county would agree to pay all the
cost of transportation if the Fund should give half the cost
of a bus, or would it be necessary to offer to pay a part of
the operating expenses also?)
