Dear (Mrs. Payne) I shall be in Washington on Monday -
but probably occupied all of the
late afternoon and evening until a reasonably late hour.
I am expecting to leave on a late, possibly a midnight,
train. I am not at all certain as to when I can see you
during the day, nor whether you are available.

Let me make this suggestion. Use the
enclosed stamped envelope to send me your telephone number
at home and await a telephone call from me in the evening.
I shall attempt to see you if it is as late as 9:30 or
10:00 P.M. even. It is barely possible that, with rather
a crowded day, I may not be able to finish in Washington
and have to return there later in the week. Please send
this information to the hotel immediately upon the receipt
of this letter, as I shall merely use the hotel as a place
for emergency during the day.
