My Dear Mr. Reynolds: The opportunity to continue my work at the University of Chicago for a second year, and the extended leave of absence from my teaching duties at West Georgia College are due to the generosity and intercession of the Rosenwald Fund in my behalf. I extend my thanks to all those concerned.

In the main my work so far has consisted of getting off language requirements and formal course requirements toward the Ph. D. in the department of Bacteriology and Parasitology. However, this fall I am definitely launched on a research program which I hope will terminate successfully in a dissertation with the provisional title;

" A Study of Variation in Mosquitoes- with special reference to the Genetics of the species *Culex pipiens* "

For the fall and winter quarters of this year the University has granted me full scholarships through the department of Bacteriology and Parasitology. In the spring quarter I shall be Dr. Huff's assistant in his course in Parasitology. This position is analogous to being a fellow in the University or the department and carries with it a stipend which defrays more than tuition costs.

By the end of the next summer quarter I hope to have completed all course, language, and preliminary examination requirements. This will mean that I shall still have to round out my research, write a dissertation and take the final examination for the Ph. D. degree. I shall have to return to Chicago to take the final examination. Finishing the research and writing the dissertation can be accomplished after I return to West Georgia College next fall.
