a public school of the state in the field that had come to its attention. Served as
chairman of Evaluation Committees which applied the "Evaluative Criteria" to Southern
Association schools and those seeking its approval from 1941 to 1945. Served as chairman
of the Principal's Section of the North Carolina Teachers Association 1943 and 1944.
