Just a word to ask you a little question. How is my application coming on? I hope that I shall have some favorable news. I have worked hard to get where I am in the medical world but I feel that I can not go further unless I get some help.

I am sorry that I was unable to go to Florida but I was unable to do so because of financial reasons. I appreciate your frank letter about the Fellowship especially your frank statements about the desire of the foundation to help men in the southern districts, in as much as there is a feeling that there are more opportunities in the North for Negro doctors than there is in the South. This report is eroneous, for the closed staff system prevents many a man with ability, from doing any original work.

I hope that you can give me some 'off the record report' as to my possibilities. I shall keep the information confidential.
