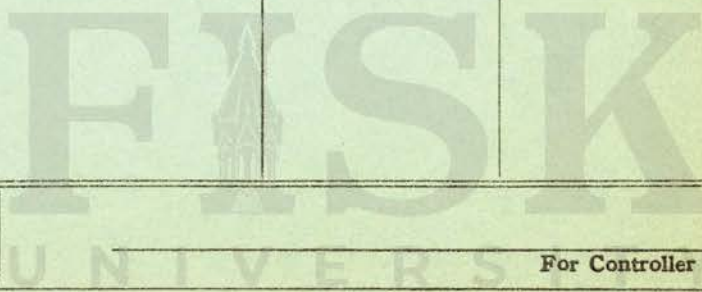

My dear Embree:

Our Toronto Research Committee greatly appreciate the generous action of your Trustees in making a five-year grant to continue the educational side of our Mental Hygiene for children of school age. This connection with your Foundation is particularly pleasing to us all because the programme we have developed during the past six years at Regal Road School is really the suggestion that you originally made when giving us a start in 1924.

Also, following your visit of last month and the suggestion you then gave that our work might benefit from a closer official relationship with the Provincial Department of Education and their College of Education, the initiative has been taken by the Department in the person of the Director of Education, Dr. Merchant, who has approached our University Governors with a proposal looking in that direction. We are now aiming to initiate some form of organization which will tie together our common interests in Education, Psychology and Medicine. When this is worked out it should give a firm basis upon which to build for the future.

Dr. Hincks has told me of your interest in our plan to have Blatz see the work and men in Europe this summer. I do not need to urge the point that his contribution here has earned that consideration. We have had it in mind for a year or more, but it should not be longer delayed if his work is to benefit from that experience.

The plan in mind is a five months' period, May 1st to Oct. 1st., to cover the principal centres of Britain and the Continent. From his reports you have seen upon other brief tours on your side, you will know that he is able to seize the cream quickly. He would like to visit several University centres and stay as long as possible at the more important ones. There would be three main objectives:

1. To see the work in Child Study
2. To study the special experiments in educational procedures, especially for children in their early school years.
3. To canvass the younger personnel interested in psychiatry on its social and educational sides.

In order to cover the necessary ground his expenses will be relatively heavy. Since I understand that your Board might be interested in assisting Dr. Blatz with a travelling fellowship for the purposes of this trip, I have written at this length about his plans. If an amount of \$2500 would be made available for him it should enable him to cover the ground
