3. Under BUDGET NO. 4 -- (Travelling expenses for visiting libraries) - I have estimated at \$450.00. In arriving at this estimate I consulted with the person in this office charged with the duty of checking up libraries for white schools. On the basis of average monthly expenses for such service, we arrived at the conclusion that not less than \$450.00 would be necessary to inspect the number of Rosenwald aid libraries we now have in the State plus the number to be placed next year.

4. Up to the present time little interest has been manifested in the installation of radio receiving sets. So many much more necessary things are clamoring for consideration that we feel that it is best not to insist on the installation of receiving sets until the schools are thoroughly equipped with the essentials for standardization and accreditation. Only two schools have made application during the current year. One failed to meet the qualifications and the other was presented with a \$250.00 set, by a local newspaper company, while the application for Rosenwald aid was pending, thus rendering it unnecessary to complete the application.

Dear Mr. Lambert: At the request of some of the states the officials of the Fund have agreed to give aid on the purchase of a combined all electric radio and electric phonograph at a cost of \$126.00.

You doubtless know that the Fund has made arrangements with Sears Roebuck and Company to purchase these radios at cost in order to keep the price down in reach of a large number of schools desiring them. I am giving you the catalogue number and selling price in the 1930 Spring and Summer catalogue for each of the three radio sets:

- (1) Cat.No.57V4076 $\frac{1}{4}$ - selling price in the 1930 Spring and Summer catalog, \$97.50 cash. *Can be* secured through special arrangement with the Fund for \$75.00.
- (2) Cat.No.57V4148 $\frac{1}{4}$ - selling price in the 1930 Spring and Summer catalog, \$124.00 cash, *Can be* secured through special arrangement with the Fund for \$90.00.
- (3) Cat.No.46V5011 - selling price in the 1930 Spring and Summer catalog, \$175.00 cash, *Can be* secured through special arrangement with the Fund for \$126.00.

In addition to the low cost shown above on each of these sets the Fund pays one-third the ~~cost through your department~~ plus transportation charges, making the actual cost of each to the schools delivered \$50, \$60, and \$84 respectively. We are prepared to have them shipped out just as rapidly as schools of four-teacher type or larger may qualify. We believe, and I am sure you will agree, that these radios will be of great value to the school and community both from the standpoint of instruction and entertainment.

Dear Mr.

We are now prepared to announce that the Fund will give aid on two kinds of radios to be placed in Negro schools of four-teacher type or larger:

- (1) A seven tube battery radio set costing \$75, on which the Fund will give \$25 aid plus transportation charges;
- (2) A nine tube all electric set - for alternating current only - costing \$90, on which the Fund will give \$30 aid plus transportation charges.

Each radio will be shipped, ready to install, including tubes and outside aerial kit with lightning arrester and instructions. Ordinarily the aerial will be satisfactory if placed about six inches above the ridge of the roof, but if the ridge cap or roof is metal the aerial should be located elsewhere.

No definite amount has been allocated to any one state for aid in purchasing radios, but we shall approve applications as they qualify until the general appropriation is used. I hope to have several orders from your state in time to be shipped before the rush of the holiday season.

Application blanks will be sent early next week. In the meantime, if you have any order ready, send it in, giving the freight shipping address, name and size of the school.

Subject: Radios for schools

Dear Mr. Smith: I have made the following arrangements with Sears, Roebuck and Company:

- (1) Cat.No.57V4076 $\frac{1}{2}$ - selling price in the 1930 Spring and Summer catalog, \$97.50 cash. Can be secured through special arrangement with the Fund for \$75.00.
- (2) Cat.No.57V4148 $\frac{1}{2}$ - selling price in the 1930 Spring and Summer catalog, \$124.00 cash. Can be secured through special arrangement with the Fund for \$90.00.
- (3) Cat.No.46V5011 - selling price in the 1930 Spring and Summer catalog, \$175.00 cash. Can be secured through special arrangement with the Fund for \$126.00.

This latter set is the combination all electric radio and electric phonograph.

When you realize that with the Fund's share of one-third, we are offering to these schools a discount of approximately 60% on Sears, Roebuck and Company merchandise, it would seem to me to be almost too good for them to appreciate. The sets we will send are, of course, brand new and from the latest catalog. They will be especially assembled and adjusted here in Chicago before being shipped to any school. I presume that the schools and officials understand that these radios are Sears, Roebuck and Company products. I am wondering if we could tell them ~~what~~ what an opportunity is being made available to them without their assuming that Sears, Roebuck and Company is trying to benefit from this transaction. In other words, I am a little fearful lest they should misconstrue an exception/opportunity as having selfish motive. If we could properly represent these radios as coming from Sears, Roebuck and Company, referring them to the catalog description, they could better judge for themselves what a special price they are securing. It should be explained to them that this price is only being made because of the fact that the Rosenwald Fund is sponsoring this project.

Orders that come to us in the fall will be filled from the fall catalog and any changes in the types of sets or prices will be allowed for.

I wish to remind you again that if we are going to continue this project for the coming year, we will have to make an allowance for it in our rural school program. Last year \$8,000 was allowed for radios. This would seem to be entirely too much on the basis that \$995 has been deducted from this allocation to date. Please estimate what you think we are likely to use for the coming fiscal year.

Regarding our distributing sets to state teacher colleges, I do not believe that we would be able to do so under the present allocation in our budget which confines this sum to rural school radios. In making up your budget for the coming year, we can include rural schools and teacher training institutions.

Mr. Stern: At the May, 1929, meeting of the Trustees a resolution (2930-1) was passed appropriating the sum of \$595,520 for "aspects of the rural school program." Allotments of this sum were made for various items, such as construction, rural school libraries, etc., and included an allotment of \$8,000 for rural school radios. It was "provided further that the officers are authorized to make adjustments between allotments within the limits of the total appropriation." It would thus appear that since this \$8,000 for radios was not an individual appropriation, it would not be necessary to lapse it but merely to adjust it as suggested in the resolution.

This appropriation was made for the fiscal year; that is, from July 1, 1929, to June 30, 1930. It may be found on p. 136 of the minutes.

To date 11 battery radios have been shipped, and 19 electric radios. Miss Elvidge estimates shipping charges at \$5.00 per radio (since all charges have not yet come through we can only estimate this). At these figures the following total to date would be indicated:

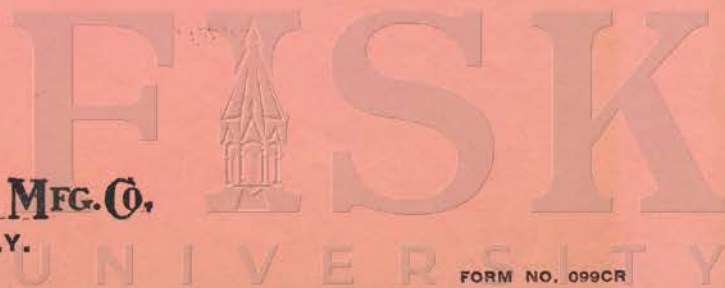


