My dear Mr. Davis:

Doctor Ernest Holder has made application to the Rosenwald Fund for a stipend to assist him to continue his training in pathology.

I should like to add to his application a few words. Dr. Holder entered the Department of Pathology at Mount Sinai Hospital July 1st, 1935. I had known him since several years before that and I had always been impressed by his sincere endeavor to learn and his ability. After he had joined the staff of my laboratory, I had the opportunity to observe him at a closer range and the good opinion I had of him became more firmly established.

Dr. Holder is a man of real ability, sincerity and utmost perseverance. He developed so well since the first year as a voluntary assistant that I endorsed his application for a fellowship at Mount Sinai Hospital and he was appointed Morris Rosenthal Fellow July 1st, 1936.
