Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of your letter of December 22, 1936, asking for my qualifications, recommendations, etc, with reference to my training in Public Health and Bacteriology.

I am 25 yrs. of age, married, but no children. I received the U. S. degree in Bacteriology from the University of Kansas with the class of '36. I have to my credit 28 hrs. of Bacteriology, 32 hrs. of Biological Sciences, 15 hrs. of Chemistry and the other prescribed courses leading to the B. S. degree.

My courses in Bacteriology included, General, Diagnostics, Immunology, Bacteriological Journals, Foods and Water and 6 hrs. of Special Problems in Hematology. Biology included Elementary courses which were prerequisites to Parasitology and Insects of Public Health. In Parasitology we studied the diseases of both round and flat worms, malaria, dysentery (amoebic) etc, with special references to the work done by the Rockefeller Institute. Insects and Public Health, included a study of all harmful and now harmful insects as related to Public Health.
