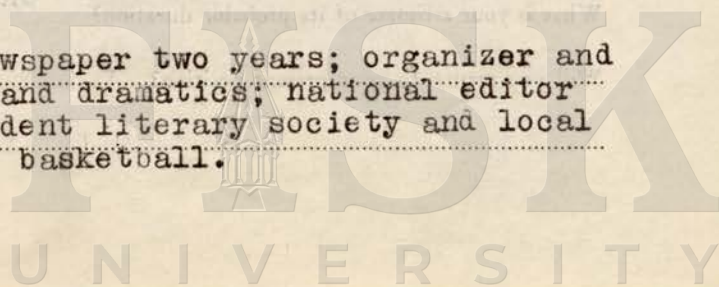

Present status of work toward degree All course work and residence requirements will be completed this Spring. There will remain the completion of the research and the writing of the dissertation.

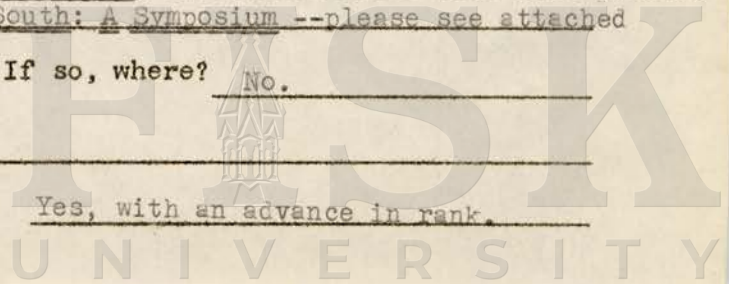
