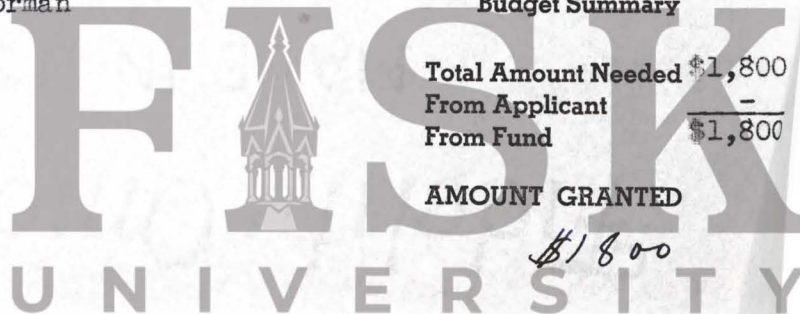

Study of Negro as a workman on Mississippi River Levee System. Thorough investigation of this field including consultation with actual workers; files in the various levee district headquarters; information from records kept by levee contractors; general research.

Requests grant for one year beginning May, 1945. Will spend time in actual field work contacting Negroes who were, or are now, employed in levee construction work; interviewing levee contractors; and visiting headquarters of levee districts in Louisiana and Mississippi until enough material has been assembled for a book which will fully depict the Negro workmen who constructed this system.
